When blood sugar levels rise too high or stay too high, blood vessels and nerves throughout the body might be damaged (Hinkle & Cheever 2022).</p> <p>Intervention 2:</p> <p>Educate the client on how important it is to get their routine labs done. Monitoring your labs helps to determine if you are reaching your glucose goals which helps to reduce the unwanted symptoms of high sugar and avoids long-term diabetes complications (Hinkle & Cheever 2022).</p> <p>Intervention 3:</p> <p>Educate on the importance of self-care. People with diabetes can enhance their quality of life and lower their risk of complications by practicing appropriate self-management.
