

## N433 – Active Learning for Ambulatory Nurse Shadowing Experience

- 1. How does this clinical site relate to the course?** Ambulatory nursing is outpatient medical services without admission to a hospital or other facility (Ricci et al., 2021). Working in this setting allows nurses to see youth between the ages of a few months to 17-year-old. Nurses can see Erikson's developmental group of trust versus mistrust to identity versus role confusion. Erikson's stages of development shows social and psychological development (Ricci et al., 2021). They also see Piaget's cognitive development of sensorimotor to formal operational. Piaget's cognitive development focuses on the nature of intelligence of all age groups (Ricci et al., 2021). These nurses promote wellness and prevent illness in all age groups by educating both the parents and the child.
- 2. How were you an engaged nursing professional today?** I was engaged in nursing by asking questions on how to triage over the phone appropriately. Although I mainly shadowed, I witnessed many phone calls with patients and learned how to report a client's concern to the physician properly. I listened as the nurse talked to the patient's parents and witnessed how the nurse could determine whether the patient should come in that day or manage the symptoms until the next day. I witnessed how the nurse charted after every phone call. He taught me how to determine what is essential to put down on the report and always to remember SBAR.
- 3. How did you contribute to the service provided by the clinic nurse today?** I contributed to the service provided by the clinic nurse today by being available. I could not go into any pediatric patient rooms, but I let the nurses know I could help with anything they needed help with that I was able to do. I also contributed by actively listening when the nurse made and received patient phone calls. I learned a lot about phone triage and how the clinic setting worked compared to the bedside. Though I did not do much during my time, I was happy to experience a different side of nursing and expand my knowledge on something new.
- 4. Name 3 ways this clinical site impacts Pediatric health?** Ambulatory nursing impacts pediatric health through critical reasoning and clinical judgment during emergencies, life-threatening, and day-to-day events. They collaborate with healthcare providers to develop a treatment plan quickly, striving to provide maximum-quality care, manages chronic and acute diseases, and prevent illness. Nurses provide safety and quality care to patients by assisting the children and their families, respecting cultural beliefs and differences, and treatment preferences. Since medication administration is vital in pediatric health, these nurses know the correct dosages for the children to prevent over or under-dosing. They are also an advocate for these children. They help give patients a voice in their medical treatment and keep them informed about the treatment and procedures.

- 5. What are the health risks of the population served during today's clinical based on your observations today?** I did not witness any health risks/concerns during my time at the clinic. My nurse showed good clinical judgment and professionalism while talking to patients. Health risks commonly seen in pediatrics are the risk of aspiration, suffocation, drowning, falls, burns, poisoning, and bodily damage (Ricci et al., 2021). Nurses should teach the parents about kitchen safety, such as not allowing little children in the kitchen while cooking or keeping all pot handles turned towards the center of the stove to prevent them from being pulled down and causing burns to the child. Parents should also receive education about car seat safety.
- 6. Choose one of the health risks identified in question 5 and develop a plan of care to address this. Include a Nursing diagnosis, a measurable goal, and at least 3 Nursing interventions to achieve this goal.** Risk for suffocation related to inadequate air available for inhalation, secondary to compromise of the patient's safety. The patient and the parents will demonstrate preventative measures for maintaining a patent airway. Children younger than four years of age are at a greater risk of severe injury or death caused by airway obstruction, which is the leading cause of death in children under one (Ricci et al., 2021). Interventions to prevent suffocation are supervising your child while he/she is eating, avoiding giving children small toys to play with, removing extra blankets and pillows from the bed, and educating the family on how to perform the Heimlich maneuver in case of an emergency.
- 7. How will your experience during the Ambulatory Clinic job shadowing impact your Nursing practice?** My experience during the ambulatory nurse job shadowing has impacted my nursing practice by showing me how critical clinic nurses are. Many parents rely on clinic nurses to provide care for their children and help them manage their child's illnesses. Clinics seem less stressful for parents when they need to bring their child in for a routine check-up or when the child becomes sick rather than bringing them to the emergency room. It made me realize that the nurses have built a trusting relationship with these families, as many of them come there frequently for the provider. Seeing the nurse interact with the families allowed me to know how to use my clinical judgment.
