| Topic: Infections: Regulations for STI Reporting <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Chlamydia is a bacterial infection caused by <i>Chlamydia trachomatis</i> and is the most reported STI in American women.• Gonorrhea is a commonly reported condition. It is the responsibility of the provider to report cases of these diseases to the local health department.• All states have a reportable diseases list. Chlamydia is a commonly reported condition. |

| Subcategory: Accident/Error/Injury Prevention |
| Topic: Home Safety: Preventing an Electrical Hazard <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In addition to taking measures to prevent injury of clients in a health care setting, nurses play a pivotal role in promoting safety in the client's home and community.• Remove items that could cause the client to trip (throw rugs and loose carpets).• Place electrical cords and extension cords against a wall behind furniture. |
| Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis |
| Topic: Communicable Diseases: Providing Education for a Client Who Has Pertussis <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Communicable diseases are spread through airborne, droplet, or direct contact transmission. Most communicable diseases can be prevented with immunizations.• Pertussis is spread via direct contact with droplets or indirect contact with a freshly contaminated |

- Patients should complete the entire course of antibiotics.

Main Category: Health Promotion and Maintenance

Subcategory: Health Screening

Topic: HIV/AIDS: Teaching About Diagnostic Testing

- Positive result from an HIV antibody screening test (enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay [ELISA]) confirmed by a positive result from a supplemental HIV antibody test (Western blot or indirect immunofluorescence assay [IFA]).
- Home test kits are also available using a drop of blood. These provide anonymous registration and counseling before the test via a telephone call.
- Clients who have a positive result from a confirmatory test (such as Western blot) should then be tested for viral load.

Subcategory: Techniques of Physical Assessment

Topic: Substance Use and Addictive Disorders: Expected Findings of Heroin Intoxication

- Heroin can be injected, smoked, inhaled, and swallowed.
- Heroin can cause slurred speech, impaired memory, pupillary changes.
- Overuse of heroin can cause decreased respirations and level of consciousness, which can cause death.

Subcategory: Coping Mechanisms

Topic: Continuity of Care: Priority Assessment for a Client Following a Traumatic Amputation

- The nurse should assess the residual limb for proper shaping and signs of infection.
- The nurse should assess the psychosocial state of the patient as they have gone through a huge bodily change.
- The nurse should ensure the patient has adequate pain control.

Subcategory: Substance Use and Other Disorders and Dependencies

Topic: Care of Specific Populations: Teaching About Treatment for Alcohol Use Disorder

- Alcohol is the most used substance in the U.S. It is socially acceptable, as well as easily accessible.
- For acute alcohol withdrawal, benzodiazepines should be administered to reduce the likelihood of seizures.
- Disulfiram can be used to aid in prevention of drinking.

Main Category: Physiological Adaptation

Subcategory: Alterations in Body Systems

Topic: Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: School Nurse Response to Koplik Spots

- Koplik spots are often seen with measles.
- The school nurse should assess the immunization status of other students to ensure they are vaccinated against measles.
- Koplik spots are small white spots that appear inside the mouth in early stages of measles.
