

1. Overview of Community Health Nursing: Applying Ethical Principles
 - a. Community health nurses are concerned with protecting, promoting, preserving, and maintaining health, as well as preventing disease.
 - b. Community health nurses address the challenges of autonomy and providing ethical care.
 - c. As nurses participate in research in the community setting, it is important to use ethical decision-making to promote client rights.
2. Regulations for STI Reporting
 - a. Reporting of communicable diseases is mandated by state and local regulations.
 - b. The state notifies the CDC voluntarily.
 - c. Surveillance can help manage a disease outbreak.
3. Preventing an Electrical Hazard
 - a. Avoid using plugs that allow for several appliances into a single outlet.
 - b. Replace missing or broken wall plates.
 - c. Treat power cords gently by never nailing or tacking them down and checking to see if they're pinched between or under furniture.
4. Home Safety Evaluation
 - a. Home safety evaluation is important to help understand the patient's health.
 - b. Any dangers in the home should be addressed and fixed.
 - c. The nurse should make any referrals to help improve the patient's living situation.
5. Identifying a Reportable Disease
 - a. Information gained from monitoring disease patterns can help identify any unusual disease outbreak or newly emerging disease.
 - b. Most nationally notifiable diseases are ones that have a vaccine against them.
 - c. The nurse must report the disease to the state health department.
6. Identifying Educator-Related Barriers to Learning
 - a. The educator could have a fear for public speaking.
 - b. The educator may not be able to adjust instruction to the learner's benefit.
 - c. A barrier for an educator may be that they're too dependent on notes.
7. HIV/AIDS: Teaching About Diagnostic Testing
 - a. A positive result from an HIV antibody screening test confirmed by a positive result for a supplemental HIV antibody test indicates a person has HIV.
 - b. Home test kits are available using a drop of blood and provide anonymous registration and counseling.
 - c. Clients who have a positive result should be tested for viral load.
8. Priority Finding During School Health Screenings
 - a. Hearing and vision problems can be detected during school screenings and are important to catch early.
 - b. Dental health problems are important to detect early.
 - c. Chronic health conditions like asthma, scoliosis, and diabetes should be detected early.
9. Expected Findings of Heroin Intoxication
 - a. Respiratory depression is found with heroin intoxication.

- b. Those who are under the influence of heroin will have a markedly decreased level of consciousness.
 - c. Extremely constricted pupils can be found on those with heroin intoxication.
10. Teaching About Treatment for Alcohol Use Disorder
- a. Detox and withdraw of alcohol will take about two to seven days.
 - b. Psychological counseling in groups and individual sessions will help the person with recovery.
 - c. Oral medications can also help prevent the person from consuming alcohol.
