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- 1) The heparin may need adjusted due to aPTT levels. The client's renal failure + dialysis may also cause adjustments.
- 2) They are both vasopressors but different medications with different actions. Although both of their uses are to raise blood pressure.
- 3) The client needs sedated because she is on a ventilator. This also increases oxygen demand on heart which can help her condition. If she needs to be un-intubated the sedation would be tapered.
- 4) The client is allergic to calcium channel blockers, but taking Cae.
- 5) The two vasopressors could be causing tachycardia 180/min.
- 6) Slow push times help prevent side effects from the drug going in too rapidly (the fastest absorbed). Pretenix main side effect is nausea.
