SAMPLE Subcategory: Case Management
SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sick Cell Crisis <ul style="list-style-type: none">• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.

Main Category: Management of Care

Subcategory: Advanced Directives/ Self Determination

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Teaching About Living Wills

- Expresses the clients wished regarding medical treatment.
- Legal in all states.
- Treatments often address actions to prolong life.

Subcategory: Assignment, delegation and supervision

Topic: Managing Client Care: Resource Management

- Provide cost effective care that does not compromise quality of care.
- Resource allocation is responsibility of unit manager.
- Budgeting is responsibility of unit manager but the nurse can provide input.

Topic: Managing Client Care: Using Time Appropriately

- Establish priorities.
- Acute before chronic.
- Systemic before local.

Subcategory: Case management

Topic: Airway Management: Discharge Planning for Client Who Has Tracheostomy

- Clean every 8 hours and as needed.
- Suction as needed.
- Monitor the opening and surrounding tissue.

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Addressing Priority Issues During Case Management

- Facilitate continuity of care.
- Advocate for client and family.
- Coordinate care for those who have complex care.

Subcategory: Client rights

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to a Client's Family Regarding Treatment

- Nurse should ask individual inquiring code and disclose information.
- Never give just anyone information about your patient.
- Only people in the clients chart should be contacted or given information.

Subcategory: Confidentiality/Information security

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to a Visitor's Question About Status of a Client

- Information cannot be given to unauthorized people.
- People must provide the code to get information.
- Never give just anyone information about your patient.

Subcategory: Continuity of care

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Change-of-Shift Report

- Include information on current health status.
- Supply oncoming nurse with pertinent client care information.
- Provide information that clarified the plan of care.

- Situation
- Background
- Assessment

Subcategory: Ethical practice

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Evaluating Staff Understanding of the Nursing Code of Ethics

- Make sure everyone knows how important this is to everyone in nursing.
- Nurses have the responsibility to be advocates.
- If there is a problem regarding the code of ethics it needs to be reported immediately.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Identifying Ethical Principles

- Autonomy
- Justice

- Nonmaleficence

Subcategory: Informed consent

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Emergency Consent for a Client Who Is Unconscious

- The law assumes that an unconscious patient would consent to emergency care.
- Emergency interventions will prevent death or disability.
- If the patient has advanced directives that are known they should be followed.

Subcategory: Information technology

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Using Electronic Resources

- Emails should be informal but in a professional tone.
- Read messages before sending.
- Never send confidential information.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Resources for Client Information

- Can read medical information.
- Can obtain a copy of medical information.
- Can use patient portal to read information.

Subcategory: Legal rights and responsibilities

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Nursing Action for a Client Who Has Chlamydia

- Encourage the use of condoms.
- Report the infection.
- Encourage to remain compliant with medications.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Priority Action to Take When Floating

- Report to the charge nurse.
- Review your level of knowledge.
- Only do things you are comfortable with.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to Suspected Child Abuse

- Nurse are mandatory reporters.
- Report any suspicion.
- Try not to act overly alarmed so the parents are not suspicious.

Subcategory: Performance improvement

Topic: Managing Client Care: Performance Improvement Process

- Identify and resolve performance deficiencies.
- Standard of care should reflect optimal goals and be based on evidence.
- Focuses on assessment of outcomes.

Topic: Pressure Injury, Wounds, and Wound Management: Assessing for Evidence of Healing

- Red means healthy regulation of tissue.
- Drainage is a result of the healing process.
- Scab is evidence of healing.

Subcategory: Referrals

Topic: The Interprofessional Team: Recognizing Need for Referral to a Speech-Language Pathologist

- Client is having difficulty swallowing.
- Client is having difficulty imitating sounds made by others.
- Client makes only a few or poor quality sounds.

Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

Subcategory: Emergency response plan

Topic: Facility Protocols: Planning for Discharge Following Community Disaster

- Discharge or relocate ambulatory clients.
- Make arrangements for continuation of care for clients who require some care.
- Don't relocate unstable patients.

Topic: Security and Disaster Plans: Priority Action to Take for Fire

- Evacuation is done first.
- Use RACE.
- Ask ambulatory clients to help evacuate other patients.

Subcategory: Reporting of incident/event/irregular occurrence/variance

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Need for Variance Report

- Used to analyze the difference between budgets and actual performance.
- Anything out of the normal course described in the patient plan of care.
- Help identify where changes need to be made.

Topic: Facility Protocols: Actions for Reporting Violation of Procedure

- Should be completed by the person that identifies that the event has occurred.
- Should be completed as soon as possible and within the 24 hours.
- Consider confidential.
