<b>SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sick Cell Crisis</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.</li></ul>

## Main Category: Management of Care

### Subcategory: Advocacy

#### Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Priority Intervention as Client advocate

- The nurse will advocate on behalf of the client.
- A nurse will stop a procedure if a client declines a procedure.
- A nurse will advocate for the client, in the best interest of the client.

### Subcategory: Assignment, Delegation and Supervision

#### Topic: Managing Client Care: Appropriate task to delegate to assistive personnel

- Assistive personnel can perform grooming and bathing activities of daily living.
- APs can feed if there are no swallowing precautions.
- Aps can assist in positioning and routine tasks.

#### Topic: Managing client care: Assignment for floating nurse

- A float nurse can complete tasks that they are competent in.
- The nurse must have the training to perform the task assigned.
- Tasks must be within the nurse's scope of practice.

#### Topic: Managing client care: Resource Management

- The budget is prepared by the manager. Input is given by support staff.
- Allocation comes from the manager.
- Quality is first with a cost-effective mindset.

#### Topic: Managing Client Care: Using Time appropriately

- Good time management skills are important.
- Prioritizing is a must! Safety, quality, and compliance should be considered.
- Determining what needs to be done prior to the end of the shift is important to plan tasks and delegate responsibilities, if applicable.

### Subcategory: Case Management

#### Topic: Coordinating Client care: addressing client issues during case management

- Cost control and care are priorities in case management.
- Advocating on behalf of the client and family is an important role for the case manager.
- Case managers can arrange resources for the client in their home setting.

### Subcategory: Collaboration with Interdisciplinary Team

#### Topic: Coordinating client care: Assessing client need for the referral at discharge

- Discharge planning begins at admissions.
- Collaborating with other interprofessional team members to get appropriate referrals in place is an important role for the case manager.
- The nurse will be sure to include the client as a partner in planning their discharge arrangements.

#### Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Promoting safety by reporting client findings to a physical therapist

- Discharge referrals are based on client needs such as special equipment for mobility needs.
- Referrals to a physical therapist and their involvement usually happens at the beginning of the process and are revisited during hospital admissions.
- Changes in clients' overall health are communicated to PT to improve patient outcomes.

### **Subcategory: Ethical Practice**

#### **Topic: Professional responsibilities: Identifying ethical principals**

- Beneficence is for the benefit of the client.
- Fidelity keeping one's promises.
- Nonmaleficence to do no harm.

### **Subcategory: Information Technology**

#### **Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Using electronic resources**

- The nurse notes, flow charts and summaries of care are all kept in an electronic medical record.
- Written summary includes discharge type, follow-up information, and contact information for therapy.
- This information is available to the client in an electronic chart. They may have access to lab information, medications, and upcoming appointments after discharge.

### **Subcategory: Legal Rights and Responsibilities**

#### **Topic: Professional Responsibilities. Nursing action for a client who has chlamydia.**

- The nurse will treat the client.
- The nurse will perform a trace/investigation in order to stop the mode of transmission (clients partner) .
- The nurse will report the case to the health department as it is reportable to the CDC.

### **Subcategory: Performance Improvement ( Quality Improvement)**

#### **Topic: Managing client care: Performance Improvement Process**

- Expectations should be clear-cut.
- Standards for the job should be set.
- Appraisals should be completed at regular intervals.

#### **Topic: Managing Client care: Understanding Critical Pathways**

- Critical pathways are the typical plan of treatment.
- Managing clinical pathways and monitoring patient progress early can control costs.
- Pathways are used to determine a set time frame for clients with similar illness or disease process.
