SAMPLE Subcategory: Case Management
SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sick Cell Crisis <ul style="list-style-type: none">• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.

Main Category: Management of Care

Subcategory: Advocacy

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to a client who is refusing treatment

- Explain to the client for not adhering to the medication regimen.
- Assess why the client is refusing treatment.
- Emphasize the benefits of the treatment to the client.

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Subcategory: Assignment, Delegation and Supervision

Topic: Managing Client Care: Appropriate task for assistive personnel

- Take the patient's vital signs.
- Assistive personnel can monitor the patient's intake and output.
- Assistive personnel can assist the client with bathing and ambulating.

Topic: Managing Client Care: Resource management

- Management is the process of planning, organizing, and directing work within an organization.
- Effective managers usually possess good leadership skills.
- Planning is the decisions regarding what needs to be done.

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Subcategory: Case Management

Topic: Airway Management: Discharge planning for client who has tracheostomy

- The patient should maintain adequate fluid intake.
- The patient should monitor their respiratory status frequently.
- They should rest and decrease environmental stimuli.

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Addressing priority issues during case management

- The nurse's role is to coordinate the interprofessional team.
- They should provide the client with the opportunity to be a partner in the development of the plan of care.
- They should provide a link to post discharge referrals that might need a referral.

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Subcategory: Client Rights

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to a client's family regarding treatment

- The nurse should use therapeutic communication when talking to the family regarding care.
- The nurse should involve the client and family in care planning.
- They should evaluate family competencies in relation to home care prior to discharge.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Right of client to reconsider procedure

- The client has the right to ask questions about to procedure before giving consent.
- The client has the right to autonomy and can make their own decisions.
- If the client has questions about their procedure, they can discuss that with the provider.

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Subcategory: Collaboration with Interdisciplinary Team

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Promoting safety by reporting client findings to a physical therapist

- The physical therapist should be notified if the client is experiencing any symptoms of respiratory distress.
- The physical therapist should also be notified if the client has any wound.
- The physical therapist should ensure fall mats are in place when getting the patient up.

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Teaching about interdisciplinary conferences

- Collaboration occurs among different levels of nurses and nurses with different areas of expertise.
- Collaboration should also occur between the interprofessional team.
- It is important to facilitate good communication skills.

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Subcategory: Concepts of Management

Topic: Client Safety: Caring for a client who has a wandering behavior

- The patient's bed should be in the lowest position.
- The nurse should ensure the patient's fall mats are in place.
- The patient should be redirected if they continue to wander.

Topic: Managing Client Care: Priority action for conflict resolution

- It is important to implement a plan before resolving conflict.
- The nurse needs to gather resources to help implement a plan.
- It is important to use risk assessment tools to evaluate client's and their environment for safety.

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Subcategory: Confidentiality/Information Security

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Responding to a visitor's questions about status of a client

- The nurse should maintain confidentiality when talking to family.
- The family should be informed about all aspects of care.
- The patient has the right to choose who they want to share personal health information with.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Teaching about confidentiality

- The nurse should not talk in the elevator about a client's condition.
- If an individual sees nurses talking to each other, they should step in and tell them to stop.
- Nurses who disclose client information to an unauthorized person can be liable for invasion of privacy.

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Subcategory: Continuity of Care

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Change-of-shift report

- The change of shift report should occur before treating patients.
- The change of shift report should include the patient's health status.
- The change of shift report is important to ensure the continuity of care.

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Subcategory: Ethical Practice

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Evaluating Staff Understanding of the Nursing Code of Ethics

- The code states that the primary commitment is the patient.
- The nurse promotes and advocates for the safety of the patient.
- The code of ethics includes nonmaleficence, beneficence, autonomy, and justice.

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Subcategory: Information Technology

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Using electronic resources

- Nurses must communicate interprofessionally through electronic means.
- E-mail communication can be informal but should maintain professional tone.
- The nurse should read messages before sending to ensure there is no negative tone.

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Subcategory: Legal Rights and Responsibilities

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Caring for a client who wants to go home

- The patient should be provided with the risks of not continuing treatment.
- The nurse should communicate with the nurse using a calm tone.
- It is important to provide reassurance to the patient.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Nursing action for a client who has chlamydia

- The patient should abstain from sexual activity for 7 days after a single dose of antibiotics.
- It is important to take all the medications prescribed to cure chlamydia.
- The nurse should check labs for culture results and educate the client about chlamydia.

Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Priority action when floating

- The nurse should communicate with the charge nurse before taking assignments.
- The nurse is always responsible for providing safe, competent nursing care.
- The nurse is expected to float to any department in the hospital.

Subcategory: Performance Improvement

Topic: Management Client Care: Performance improvement process

- The improvement process is defined as any action taken by management to improve performance.
- It is important to identify underlying issues.
- The nurse should set clear objectives.

Topic: Management Client Care: Understanding critical pathways

- It is a critical path for coordinating teamwork.
- It helps medical care providers to coordinate proper delivery of patient care.
- It is a map that tells the step of patient care protocols and the expected progression of patients.

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Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

Subcategory: Accident/Error/Injury Prevention

Topic: Maintaining a Safe Environment: Assessing a client's home for safety hazards

- Long extension cords should not be left out.
- Equipment should be regularly inspected.
- The client should place items where it is easy to locate.

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Subcategory: Reporting of Incident/Event/Irregular Occurrence/Variance

Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Need for variance report

- It is a document that compares planned financial outcomes with the actual financial outcome.
- It is associated with the patient themselves.
- The variance is determined by deducting the actual costs from the standard costs.

Topic: Facility Protocols: Evaluating nurse response to client fall

- A incident report should be completed after patient falls.
- The patient's vital signs should be taken immediately.
- The incident report should not be mentioned in the client's health record.

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Subcategory: Security Plan

Topic: Facility Protocols: Emergency evacuation of clients

- Each facility must have an emergency operating plan.
- Patients in immediate danger due to fire or smoke should be removed first.
- Running involves evacuation if there is clear path of exit.

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Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis

Topic: Maintaining a Safe Environment: Evaluating the implementation of infection control measures

- Staff education on infection prevention and control is a responsibility of the nurses.
- The nurse should dispose sharps in a sharp container immediately after use.
- It is important to keep designated equipment in the rooms of clients who are on contact precautions.
