

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1. Tell me about a time when you had to solve a problem creatively.

I once had a patient who disliked heel protectors on their feet because they were uncomfortable. The patient complained that her heels were hurting because they were sitting on the bed, but she did not want her heel protectors on because they also caused her pain, so I had to think of another way to help her without putting them

on her. I explained to my nurse that the patient had heel pain but did not want her heel protectors on because they were very uncomfortable, and it was hard for her to sleep with the heel protectors on. I explained my new solution to the problem, and the nurse was fine with the solution I came up with. I came up with a solution that did not require the moon boots but also relieved her pain on the back of her heels. I put two soft pillows under her legs to prevent the heels from touching the bed. The patient was satisfied with my creative way of solving the problem. She told me that since the pillows are under her legs, her heels do not hurt, and she is not uncomfortable. The patient thanked me for the solution I came up with.

1. Tell me about a time you advocated for a patient in the clinical setting.

I had a patient on the night shift who wanted to use the restroom but had a difficult time walking to the restroom. After getting the patient back in bed, I felt something was wrong with this patient. I left the patient's room and spoke with the nurse about the patient. I was told that the patient always has a difficult time with walking and has shortness of breath. I continued to advocate for the patient, so the nurse decided to complete a head-to-toe assessment of the patient. The nurse and I went in to complete a quick head-to-toe assessment. The patient still had shortness of breath and began complaining of chest pain. After completing a quick head-to-toe assessment, the nurse decided it would be better for the patient to be sent to the hospital because they complained about chest pain and shortness of breath even after taking nitroglycerin tablets. The patient asked for family members because they did not want to be alone while waiting for the ambulance. I sat by the patient's side in the room and held their hand because they wanted to hold my hand until the ambulance came. A few days later, I noticed a card on the wall in the hallway with my name on it, and that patient's name was signed. The patient had written a card thanking me for the care that I provided for them.
