Topic: Managing Client Care: Appropriate Delegation to an Assistive Personnel <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Delegating is the process of transferring responsibility onto another team member to complete a task.• Nurses should consider legal and ethical concerns when delegating to other team members.• Nurses must follow the ANA code of standards in delegating tasks.
Topic: Managing Client Care: Determining Tasks to Delegate to Assistive Personnel <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Nurses should consider the potential harm that delegating a task may cause.• Nurses should consider the complexity of the task and if the assistive personnel have the appropriate skill set.• Assistive personnel are specifically trained to assist nurse in client care activities.
Subcategory: Collaboration with Interdisciplinary Team
Topic: Coordinating Client Care: Reporting Information to the Provider <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The nurse should report assessment data integral to changes in client status to the provider.• The nurse should report recommendations for changes in a clients plan of care to the provider.• If a nurse needs a clarification of a prescription, then they should notify the provider.
Topic: Maintaining a Safe Environment: Instructing Assistive Personnel About Wrist Restraints <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Wrist restraints should be limited to 8 hours for adults.• Assistive personnel should offer food, fluids, hygiene and address elimination needs every 2 hours.• Assistive personnel should never leave the client unattended when restraints are in use.
Topic: Managing Client Care: Responding to Medication Errors <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The nurse should first assess the client and ensure they are safe after a medication error.• The nurse should report the medication error to the provider after ensuring the client is safe.• The nurse should file an incident report when there is a medication error.
Subcategory: Legal Right and Responsibilities
Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Resources for Planning Policies <ul style="list-style-type: none">• HIPPA or the Health Insurance Probability and Accountability Act is a resource for nurses to understand how to maintain client confidentiality.• Policies and procedures are in the facilities policy and procedure manual.• It is important that nurses are familiar with their institutions policies because they differ from facility to facility.
Subcategory: Informed Consent
Topic: Professional Responsibilities: Surgical Consent for an Emancipated Minor <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Emancipated minors can provide informed consent for themselves.• Clients must be competent and of legal age or be an emancipated minor to give informed consent.• State laws regulate who is able to give informed consent and may have age limitations.
Subcategory: Establishing Priorities
Topic: Managing Client Care: Prioritizing Postpartum Care for a Group of Client <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Assistive personnel can measure the vital signs of a client who is postpartum and stable.• A postpartum client with blood loss of 500 mL vaginally is an emergent situation.• Nurses must prioritize patient care based on most emergent to least emergent.

Subcategory: Accident/Error/Injury Prevention

Topic: Maintaining a Safe Environment: Assessing a Client's Home for Safety Hazards

- The client should remove all throw rugs from the area to avoid falls.
- All extension cords should be secured or removed to avoid tripping hazards.
- Use of grab bars and shower chairs help keep the client safe in the bathroom.

Subcategory: Reporting of Incident/Event/Irregular Occurrence/Variance

Topic: Facility Protocols: Completing Documentation Following a Client Fall

- An incident report should be filed following a client fall.
- The nurse should first assess the client and ensure they are safe following a fall.
- Incident reports should be filed within 24 hours and not be placed in the clients health record.

Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis

Topic: Infection Control: Teaching About Use of Protecting Environment Precautions

- A protective environment is used to protect clients who are immunocompromised.
- A protective environment requires a private room with positive airflow.
- Clients that need a protective environment should wear a mask when out of the room and stay away from sick people and large crowds.

Topic: Facility Protocols: Disaster Triage Tagging

- A red tag is the highest priority given to clients who have life-threatening injury.
- A yellow tag is the second highest priority given to clients who have major injures but are not yet life-threatening.
- A green tag is the next highest priority given to clients with minor non-life-threatening injuries.
