<b>SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sick Cell Crisis</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.</li></ul>

## Main Category: Management of Care

### Subcategory: Management of Care

#### Topic: Assessment

- Collect subjective and objective data
- Perform a physical assessment and gather the lab results
- Know the manifestations diagnosis

#### Topic: Evidence Based Practice

- Review the policy and procedure handbook
- Use evidence-based practice to validate nursing interventions
- Use evidence-based practice to evaluate nursing skills to help perform tasks

#### Topic: Informatics

- Can help improve quality improvement
- Doing audits will help identify the need for quality improvement
- Informatics can help you gain skills, acknowledge, and your attitude

### Subcategory: Safety and Infection Control

#### Topic: Security and Disaster Plans

- If a nurse notices a fire use RACE (rescue, alarm, contain, and extinguish)
- Turn off any oxygen for the client's safety
- Remove clients from area

#### Topic: Health Promotion and Disease Prevention

- Primary prevention: immunization programs, child car seat education, fitness activities, education in schools
- Secondary prevention: screenings, treatment, and exercise programs who are frail
- Tertiary: begins after illness, promoting independence after injury, rehabilitation center

#### Topic: Therapeutic Communication

- Need to build trust with client
- Allow time to communicate with the patient
- Have a nonjudgmental attitude towards the patient and their family.

### Subcategory: Health Promotion and Maintenance

#### Topic: Coping

- Encourage client to cope in a health way
- A nurse should teach a client about stress-management after coping with the crisis
- Have the client describe their past coping skills

#### Topic: Self-concept and sexuality

- As a nurse you need to assess your own comfort levels and problems related to sexuality
- Body image can change with cognitive growth and physical development
- As a nurse you need to know that sexuality is influenced by culture

#### Topic: Culture

- Everybody's culture affects their health beliefs
- Being a culturally competent nurse means knowing the different boundaries of each culture
- A client's spirituality plays a role in the client's belief on their health

## Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

### Subcategory: Psychosocial Integrity

#### Topic: Greif, Loss, and Palliative Care

- Each client experience loss and grief differently
- Allow time for the client to go through the grieving process
- Palliative care interventions focus on the relief of the physical manifestations as well as comforting the spiritual care of the client

#### Topic: Hygiene

- Every client has different hygiene preferences
- Culture can play a role in hygiene and nurses need to respect that
- Nurses need to be considerate of older adult clients when bathing them, their skin is drier and thinner than younger adults

#### Topic: Pain Management

- It is the nurse's top responsibility to measure the client's pain level
- Not treating a client's pain can lead to serious health problems
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### Subcategory: Basic Care and Comfort

#### Topic: Mobility and Immobility

- A client needs to move the cane 15 to 25 cm (6 to 10 in) in front of them while walking
- A client who is using crutches needs to support the body weight at the hand grips with the elbows flexed at 20 to 30 degrees
- Nurses need to be very cautious with older adults who have thinner and fragile skin

#### Topic: Complementary and Alternative Therapies

- These therapies are based on Eastern medical systems
- Alternative therapies are treatment approaches that become the primary treatment and replace allopathic medical care
- More clients are using Cam and the number is rising

#### Topic: Bowel Elimination

- Ostomies are either in the large intestine or small intestine
- Monitor the client's fluid status
- Monitor the client's electrolyte imbalances

### Subcategory: Pharmacological and Parenteral Therapies

#### Topic: Pharmacokinetics and Routes of Administration

- The rate of medication absorption is determined how soon the medication takes effect
- Elimination of medications is through the kidneys, liver, lungs, intestines, and exocrine glands
- When a client is taking a DPI they need to rinse their mouth with water or brush their teeth to reduce the risk of a fungal infection in the mouth

#### Topic: Safe Medication Administration and Error Reduction

- As a nurse it is your responsibility to report any medication errors
- Uncontrolled substances require monitoring
- Medications have a specific risk and toxicity

#### Topic: Dosage Calculation

- Nurses are responsible for administering the correct amount of medication that is ordered
- Nurses are responsible for calculating the precise amount of medication that is ordered
- A nurse can figure out an IV drip rate but counting the number of drops in the chamber of 1 minute

**Main Category: Health Promotion and Maintenance**

**Subcategory: Reduction of risk potential**

**Topic: Intravenous Therapy**

- Nurses administer medications as an IV bolus
- Solutions and IV catheters can irritate the lining of the vein
- In clients who have fragile veins, avoid tourniquets

**Topic: Specimen Collection for Glucose Monitoring**

- Monitoring blood glucose levels is a critical component in care of clients who have diabetes
- When giving insulin, rotate sites to avoid tenderness
- Smearing the blood onto the testing strip can cause inaccurate reading

**Topic: Airway Management**

- Assessment includes respiratory assessment and measuring vitals
- A nurse's priority is to maintain the client's airway
- Promote oral hygiene

**Subcategory: Physiological adaptation**

**Topic: Pressure Injury, Wounds, and Wound Management**

- Maturation occurs on or about day 21
- Dehydration is an issue that can affect wound healing
- Wound care includes assessment, cleansing, and protection

**Topic: Fluid Imbalances**

- Risk factors include vomiting and diarrhea
- Labs: Hct, blood osmolarity, urine specific gravity, blood sodium, BUN
- Assess heart rhythm

**Topic: Bacterial, Viral, Fungal, and Parasitic Infections**

- Risk factors: alcohol consumption, smoking, and malnutrition
- Therapies: Glucocorticosteroids and Antineoplastics
- Age is a risk factor for developing infections
