<ul style="list-style-type: none">• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.

Main Category: Management of Care

Subcategory: Advance directives/ self-determination/life planning

Topic: professional responsibilities: client advocacy regarding advance directives

- Communicate client wishes regarding end of life care once a patient is unable to do so.
- Living will is a component of advance directives
- Dural power of attorney for healthcare is a component of advance directives

Subcategory: Assignment, delegation and supervision

Topic: leading and managing client care: resource management

- Management is the process of planning, organizing, directing, and coordinating the work within an organization.
- Leadership is the ability to inspire others to achieve a desired outcome.
- Managers have formal positions of power and authority. Leaders might have only the
- informal power afforded them by their peers.

Subcategory: Case management

Topic: airway management: discharge planning for client who has tracheostomy

- Suction your tracheostomy tube. This clears the secretions from your airway so it's easier to breathe.
- Clean the suction catheter. This helps prevent infection.
- Clean your skin around your tracheostomy.

Subcategory: collaboration with interdisciplinary team

Topic: Coordinating client care: priority findings to report for a client who has meningitis

- Droplet precaution
- Fever, chills
- Altered level of consciousness

Subcategory: Concept of management

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: securing client valuables

- A culture of safety is one that promotes openness and error reporting. Developing a culture of safety often results in a lower number of adverse events.
- Facilities should have a risk management department to help identify hazards, prevent adverse events, track the occurrence of negative client incidents, and manage hazards.
- There are several types of events that are reported and tracked under risk management programs.

Subcategory: Establishing priorities

Topic: Professional practice: Making decisions for end-of-life care

- The Uniform Determination of Death Act (UDDA) can be used to assist with end-of-life and organ donor issues.
- A determination of death must be made in accordance with accepted medical standards.
- Advance directives can make this decision if the patient is unable to do so.

Topic: Professional practice: Mandatory reporting of sexually transmitted infections

Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

Subcategory: Accident/error/injury prevention

Topic: inclusive and evidence-based care environment: Teaching about airborne precautions

- Should keep the door to the room closed
- Wear a mask
- Clean your hands with soap and water

Subcategory: Emergency response plan

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: Role of the nurse during a disaster

- Provide first aid
- Advanced clinical care
- Lifesaving medications, assess and triage victims

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: Teaching about actions to take during a fire

- Get low and go under the smoke
- Close the door behind you
- Place a wet towel under the door

Subcategory: Reporting of incident/event/ irregular occurrence/variance

Topic: Culture and safety in delivering care: actions to take when completing an incident report

- Take note of any damages and injuries
- Should respond immediately
- Identify the witness and take statements

Subcategory: Security plan

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: caring for a client who has been exposed to anthrax

- Take measures to protect self and avoid contact
- Try to contain the material in one place prior to the arrival of the hazardous materials team
- Decontaminate affected individuals as much as possible at or as close as possible to the scene
