Course Student Learning Outcomes (CSLOs):

Upon completion of this course students will be able to:

- Apply the principles of basic physiologic processes to systemic diseases.
- Explain the human response to disease processes.
- Identify the etiology, pathogenesis, and clinical manifestations of illness or injury.

Course Requirements:

1. Students must be on time for class.
2. Students must submit all assignments on time.
3. Students arriving late on test dates may be denied entrance to the class due to distracting the exam-taking students. The student then may be given an unexcused absence and will need to reschedule the test with the instructor.
4. Anything that interrupts student learning is considered disruptive. If the student is asked to leave the classroom due to disruptive behavior, which may include falling asleep, it will be considered as an unexcused absence.
5. Students are expected to have cell phones silenced and off the vibration mode. Students should not use their cell phones or other technology during class time unless it is related to the class content and directed to do so by the instructor. Cell phones will be turned to airplane mode during testing.
6. Course content reading assignments should be done before coming to the classroom setting so the student can participate in the discussion and bring questions to class.
7. Students will take all class exams in the classroom with their own computer device unless otherwise instructed by the course coordinator.
8. Students must wear their Lakeview College of Nursing picture name badge to ALL classes. If you come to class, you will not be admitted until you have it on. In the case of exams, if you arrive without your photo name badge, you will **not** be admitted or allowed to take the examination.
9. Students are not allowed to leave the classroom during exams and re-enter to continue testing without permission granted before the test begins.
10. Students will quietly leave the classroom after testing and will not be allowed to re-enter until after all students have completed testing to avoid distraction.
11. Students are not allowed to ask questions during an exam on the exam content.

12. The student must achieve a minimum cumulative course average of at least 77%, and a cumulative exam average of 77% must be achieved before any other course work will be calculated into the final grade.
13. The absent student is responsible for obtaining the course material from another source and is accountable for the information presented in the class. See the Student Handbook.
14. Students will display behavior in accordance with the mission and vision of the college.
15. Students will not challenge exam scores or discuss exam questions in class. If the student wishes to discuss the exam, a private session with the instructor should be scheduled.

Access and Accommodations


