<b>SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sickle Cell Crisis</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.</li><li>• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.</li></ul>

## Main Category #1: Reduction of Risk Potential

### • Subcategory: Potential for Complications from Surgical Procedures and Health Alterations

**Topic:** Acute and Infectious Respiratory Illnesses: Priority Finding Following a Tonsillectomy.

- Excessive bleeding from the patient's mouth or blood-tinged sputum (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Excessive swallowing or clearing of throat could be a result of bleeding (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Difficulty breathing and tachycardia should be assessed (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

### Subcategory: System-Specific Assessments

**Topic:** Diabetes Mellitus Management: Manifestations of Hypoglycemia.

- The patient expresses mental confusion or mental status change from baseline (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- The patient experiences blurred vision (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- The patient experiences seizure activity (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

### Subcategory: Therapeutic Procedures

**Topic:** Diagnostic and Therapeutic Procedures for Female Reproductive Disorders: Preparing a Client for a Pelvic Examination.

- Inform client to void prior to examination (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Inform client to schedule this examination 6-10 days after their last menstrual cycle (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- During internal examination, inform client to take deep breaths and relax muscles and "bear down" while speculum is being inserted (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

**Topic:** Disorders of the Eye: Evaluating a Client's Understanding of Cataract Removal

- Instruct client to utilize sunglasses when outside or in direct sunlight (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Instruct client to avoid activities that may increase IOP. Example: Bending over or excessively blowing nose (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Report any signs of infection including yellow or green discharge (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

**Topic:** Fractures: Planning Care for a Child Who Is in Skeletal Traction

- Ensure that the weights are not within the child's reach (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Ensure that the ropes are in the pulley and that the child cannot reach the ropes (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Ensure weights are hanging freely (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

## Main Category #2: Psychosocial Integrity

### Subcategory: Chemical and Other Dependencies/Substance Use Disorder

**Topic:** Substance Use Disorders: Actions for Acute Alcohol Toxicity.

- medications to assist with the treatment of alcohol withdrawal (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Naltrexone is a medication that assists with the suppression of cravings during alcohol withdrawal

(Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

- Clonidine assists with the effects of withdrawal including nausea, diarrhea, and vomiting (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

### Subcategory: Mental Health Concepts

**Topic:** Basic Mental Health Nursing Concepts: Assessing an Older Adult.

- Assess the patient's LOC baseline (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Assess Benzodiazepine, the patient's level of pain and how it affects the patient's mental status (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Assess the patient's current LOC and any change in LOC (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

## Main Category #3: Basic Care and Comfort

### Subcategory: Nutrition and Oral Hydration

**Topic:** Bowel Elimination: Identifying an Expected Finding with Dehydration.

- Constipation occurs because of the body's reaction to the loss of fluid and electrolytes during dehydration (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- The patient may experience hard stools that are hard for the patient to pass without assistance (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Medications or fluids may need to be utilized to assist with regaining electrolyte levels or to assist with softening stools so the patient can pass stool comfortably (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).

**Topic:** Modified Diets: Selecting Foods for a Client Who Has Dysphagia.

- Thickened liquids may be utilized to prevent aspiration (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Meats utilized for the patient's diet can be grounded or moistened and may utilize gravy when serving it to the patient (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
- Soft foods may be utilized to assist with the patient's ability to properly swallow and to assist with the prevention of aspiration (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2024).
