

N433 – Active Learning for Ambulatory Nurse Shadowing Experience

1. How does this clinical site relate to the course?

This clinical site is closely tied to the objectives of N433 Infant, Child, and Adolescent Health, focusing on applying nursing theory and skills in an ambulatory, outpatient setting. Observing the diverse responsibilities of nursing staff, including their role in managing patient care, educating families, and maintaining immunization records, was integral in connecting course material to real-life practice. The site showcases preventive care and health promotion, two key components of pediatric nursing, by focusing on vaccine administration, managing chronic conditions, and providing care to children with behavioral challenges. By seeing firsthand how a clinical team works together to manage both routine and urgent health needs, I gained a better understanding of how ambulatory pediatric nursing supports the broader goals of pediatric care (Phelps, 2022). Literature underscores that ambulatory care nurses play a critical role in early health intervention and education, contributing to improved patient outcomes through preventive care and patient engagement (Garcia & Nguyen, 2020; Hall et al., 2021).

2. How were you an engaged nursing professional today?

Today, I made a point to be highly engaged by actively participating in clinical activities, which included requesting a full tour of the facility and learning about each area's role in patient care. Observing the sensory room was especially informative, as it allowed me to see the clinic's approach to accommodating pediatric patients with ADHD, autism, and other behavioral needs. This experience highlighted the importance of having specialized spaces to provide appropriate care and manage sensory sensitivities. Additionally, I asked several questions regarding the vaccination process, protocols for insurance coverage (both VFC and private), and how to care for a newborn with jaundice, reinforcing

my knowledge of practical pediatric care. Engaging in these discussions allowed me to gain insights into both the administrative and clinical aspects of ambulatory nursing. Research shows that such active engagement in clinical practice aids in bridging knowledge gaps, enhancing professional competency, and promoting effective patient care (Smith & Taylor, 2020).

3. How did you contribute to the service provided by the clinic nurse today?

I contributed to the service provided by the clinic nurse by supporting activities that aligned with infection prevention, immunization protocols, and polypharmacy management. My role involved asking clarifying questions about procedures for vaccinations, particularly for the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program versus private insurance coverage, to understand how the clinic ensures compliance with state and federal guidelines. This engagement helped me reinforce the importance of accurate immunization records in preventing pediatric infections, especially in a setting that serves a high volume of children who may not yet be fully vaccinated. I also learned about the infection control measures in place, observing their relevance to the pediatric population that is more vulnerable to communicable diseases (Phelps, 2022). My contribution aligned with recent findings on the value of active student involvement in ambulatory care settings, which is shown to enhance the quality of patient-centered care and support nursing education in a real-world environment (Brown et al., 2023).

4. Name **3** ways this clinical site impacts Pediatric health?

This clinical site impacts pediatric health in several ways. First, it promotes disease prevention by administering vaccinations to protect against various infectious diseases, such as whooping cough, flu, and hepatitis. This vaccination service helps lower infection rates and contributes to community immunity, reducing the risk of outbreaks. Second, the site offers a sensory room specifically designed to accommodate pediatric patients with autism and ADHD, providing a calm and supportive environment for care. The lighting, bubble mirror, and interactive game play were amongst my favorite features in the room. The use of such tailored resources in pediatric settings has been linked to improved patient outcomes and better experiences for children with behavioral needs (Garcia & Nguyen, 2020). Third, the

clinic's screening practices, such as early jaundice detection in infants, allow for timely intervention, which is crucial for preventing complications. By offering these services, the clinic plays a critical role in addressing the unique health needs of pediatric patients, ultimately contributing to healthier childhood development and disease prevention in the community.

5. What are the health risks of the population served during today's clinical based on your observations today?

During today's clinical experience, I observed several health risks facing the pediatric population served by the clinic. Respiratory infections, including pneumonia and whooping cough, are particularly common in young children due to their developing immune systems. According to the staff so far in comparison to last year, there has been an increase in the presence of whooping cough this season in this community. Additionally, conditions such as jaundice in neonates present a risk if not detected and managed early, as untreated jaundice can lead to severe health complications, including kernicterus. Upper respiratory infections, such as strep throat, were also prevalent among the patients, as children are more susceptible to communicable diseases in shared environments like schools and daycare centers (Hall et al., 2021). Seasonal illnesses, such as the flu and colds, were also noted, underscoring the need for proactive measures like vaccination and hygiene education. According to research, pediatric populations in ambulatory settings face heightened risks for certain infections, particularly if immunization schedules are delayed or if infection control practices are not rigorously followed (Jones et al., 2021).

6. Choose one of the health risks identified in question 5 and develop a plan of care to address this. Include a Nursing diagnosis, a measurable goal, and at least 3 Nursing interventions to achieve this goal.

Health Risk: Pneumonia

Nursing Diagnosis: Ineffective airway clearance related to respiratory infection as evidenced by labored breathing, coughing, and decreased oxygen saturation levels (Phelps, 2022).

Goal: The patient will demonstrate improved respiratory function, and clear breath sounds within 48 hours of implementing the plan of care.

Nursing Interventions:

- a) **Respiratory Assessment:** Monitor and assess the patient's respiratory rate, effort, and oxygen saturation every 4 hours to detect early signs of respiratory distress and to ensure timely interventions.
 - b) **Encourage Hydration:** Provide fluids appropriate for age to help thin respiratory secretions, which assists with airway clearance. Adequate hydration has been shown to improve secretion management, particularly in pediatric patients with pneumonia (Brown et al., 2023).
 - c) **Educate Family Members:** Provide education to parents or caregivers on the importance of hand hygiene, avoiding exposure to sick individuals, and maintaining a smoke-free environment to prevent further respiratory complications (Hall et al., 2021).
7. How will your experience during the Ambulatory Clinic job shadowing impact your Nursing practice?

This experience underscored the unique demands of pediatric ambulatory care, particularly the balance between clinical duties and administrative tasks. While the clinic provided valuable insights into the organizational aspects of nursing, such as inventory management for vaccinations and communication with insurance providers, it highlighted that much of the hands-on care is delegated to certified medical assistants (CMAs). This division of responsibilities affected my perception of the role and suggested that it may not provide the level of direct patient interaction I seek in my nursing practice. Studies indicate that as ambulatory care evolves, nurses' roles may involve more oversight and coordination of care rather than direct clinical interventions, a shift that has implications for patient outcomes and nurse satisfaction (Evans & Lewis, 2021). Although I appreciated the opportunity to understand the scope of ambulatory nursing, this experience has reinforced my preference for clinical settings with more comprehensive patient engagement.
