Discussion Questions

Is the setting appropriate to care for this client? Why or why not?

Yes, the setting is appropriate. The patient came to the hospital for treatment of a type two diabetes exacerbation.

- What considerations (culture, literacy, religion, diet, economics, education, pronouns, gender identity, etc.) should you address when caring for this client?

The nurse should consider culture, literacy, religion, diet, economics, education, pronouns, and gender identity when caring for this client. These steps were made throughout the simulation. The client's religion was not stated in report and therefore the nurse should ask the client.

- What resources or supplies will you need when caring for this client?

Orders for the necessary medications such as insulin need to be obtained when caring for the client as well as the medications themselves. A dietitian would be helpful due to this patient not following his recommended diet. Educational pamphlets would also be a good resource to this patient.

Recognize Cues (Assessment)

- Was the report effective for you to care for this client?

Yes the report was effective for me to care for this patient.

- What information is missing from the scenario and is needed to effectively care for the client?

More extensive lab information would be helpful in providing a full picture of the client's health. More information on the client's religious beliefs is needed. More information on this client's lifestyle is needed.

- What information was relevant to the client's condition?

The client having a myocardial infarction is relevant to his condition due to the risk of this occurring being elevated as well as needing to monitor the client's cardiac condition more closely. Previous heart damage may have occurred. The client's type two diabetes diagnosis is relevant to this client. The client

not following the recommended diet is relevant information to this client. If the client is not properly managing his condition, this can worsen his overall health.

- What subtle changes did you recognize in the client's condition? What condition

were the subtle changes in the client's health status related to? The patient's blood pressure was elevated. The client has a blood pressure of 146/94. This is elevated compared to the desired 120/80. This can be related to stress. Anytime a patient has exacerbating symptoms leading them to seek medical attention can be stressful for them. I would also like to learn more about the client's diet and potassium and sodium labs to determine if this is a contributing factor to the patient's high blood pressure. Activity level may also be helpful in identifying a lifestyle factor contributing to high blood pressure and in turn choosing the correct form of treatment and education for the client.

Analyze Cues (Analysis)

- Compare the client findings to the evidence-based resources and standards of care. Many of the client's systems analysis was within defined limits. The standard of care focuses on the client's main issue and priority of treatments. In this case, the client was experiencing numbness in his toes and his oxygen levels are within normal limits. In this case, I would be concerned about peripheral neuropathy. In another case I would be worried about a blood clot.

- What are the specific needs of this client?

This client needs education on management of diabetes. This client needs insulin based on his diabetes scores which shall be ongoing.

- What are the potential complications this client may experience?

This client may experience peripheral neuropathy as evidenced by his diabetes diagnosis, not following dietary recommendations, and numbness in his toes.

- What findings are of immediate concern for this client? The numb toes are an immediate concern for this client. While his blood pressure is elevated, it is not critically concerning.

Prioritize Hypotheses (Analysis)

- Identify and rank the top three problems for this client. Provide a rationale for your decision on the rank order.

1. Diabetes
2. Cardiac Health
3. High blood pressure

Generate Solutions (Planning)

- What interprofessional health care team member will need

to be included in establishing a plan of care? A dietitian should be included in the client's plan of care to establish a diabetic diet appropriate for this client. Adjustments may need to be made based on the willingness of the client to comply.

Take Actions (Implementation)

- Identify the nursing actions that should be taken based on the prioritized client problems. The nurse should monitor glucose levels and administer insulin accordingly. This nurse should also educate the client on complications from uncontrolled diabetes. The nurse should monitor the client's cardiac status continually. The nurse should monitor the client's blood pressure and attempt to identify a causative factor of high blood pressure. The nurse may then be able to work with the provider to establish an appropriate treatment plan.
- Identify the potential impact the nursing action has on the client outcomes.

The client may be more inclined to adhere to proper at home care for diabetes if educated about possible complications of diabetes. The client's previous myocardial infarction places him at risk for cardiac complications and should be educated on diet and exercise to achieve a potential outcome of avoiding cardiac events. The client will have a better understanding of his health if a cause of his high blood pressure is defined. The client's health may improve if proper treatment of high blood pressure is established.

Evaluate Outcomes (Evaluation)

- What responses by the client would indicate that the nursing actions were effective?

The client expressing understanding of the education would indicate the nursing actions were effective. The client expressing desire to improve his health would indicate success of the nursing interventions.

- What are the safety concerns you identified caring for the client(s)?

Safety concerns are related to the client's uncontrolled diabetes. Peripheral neuropathy, infections, and poor wound healing are some of the safety concerns for the client which may result from the client not caring for his diagnosis properly.
