Main Category: Clinical Judgement

Subcategory: Take actions

Topic: Dermatitis and acne: Discharge instructions for toddler's parent.

1. Teach the parent to use mild soap and water to clean facial skin with acne.
2. Parent can use gentle moisturizer or emollient.
3. If acne are spread below the nipple line, all over the body, take the toddler to the doctor.

Topic: Hematologic disorder: Planning care for an adolescent with vasoocclusive crisis.

1. Vasoocclusive crisis occurs in patients with sickle cell anemia and is caused by symmetrical obstruction of blood vessels in hands and feet.
2. The care of these patients starts with regulating pain.
3. Hydration is very important via IV or orally.
4. Penicillin prophylaxis decreases infection complications.

Subcategory: Pathophysiology

Topic: Complication in infant: Expected findings of necrotizing enterocolitis.

1. Necrotizing enterocolitis can develop in premature babies.
2. Distended abdomen is another finding.
3. The stool contains occult blood in these infants.

Topic: Fracture and unexpected response to therapies

1. One of complications bone fractures in children is injury of organs and tissues located around the fracture.
2. After the therapy, compartment syndrome can develop.

3. Another problem can occur and that is a fat embolism. This is caused by bone marrow escaping from the long bones into the blood vessels.

4. Patient can have a significant blood loss.
