These actions may be relevant interventions in other situations but were not helpful related in this scenario. Spend time reviewing use of guided imagery as a non-pharmacological pain relief intervention.</p> |
| | <p>Evidence-Based Practice</p> <p><i>Major</i> - You selected one or more actions that caused harm or increased risk of negative outcome for the client. Therefore, further study of evidence-based practice standards and guidelines for conducting a pain assessment is needed prior to completing the scenario again. Spend time reviewing how to assess pain characteristics, how to use a client's pain rating to guide analgesia selection, essential information needed prior to administering pain medication, and potential adverse effects of opioid medications.</p> |
| | <p>Safety Factors and Infection Control</p> <p><i>Major</i> - You selected one or more actions that caused harm or increased risk of negative outcome for the client. Therefore, further study of safety factors and infection control is needed prior to completing the scenario again. Spend time reviewing the onset of action of oral pain medications.</p> |
