Acute	1	100.0%	A disease, condition or injury characterized by a relatively sudden onset of symptoms that are usually severe. An episode of acute disease results in: recovery to a state comparable to the client's condition of health and activity before the disease; progression into a chronic illness; or death.
Chronic	11	72.7%	A disease or condition that persists for 6 months or more, or in which a cure is not expected. Chronic diseases generally cannot be prevented by vaccines or cured by medication, nor do they just disappear.

Clinical Prevention and Population Health	2	0.0%	The need for nurses to be able to identify health related risk factors and facilitate behaviors that support health promotion, and disease and injury prevention, while providing population-focused care that is based on principles of epidemiology and promotes social justice.

Topics include foundational mental health concepts (e.g., therapeutic communication, therapeutic milieu, legal/ethical issues), care of clients experiencing psychobiologic disorders or psychiatric emergencies, and care of clients receiving traditional nonpharmacological and psychopharmacological therapies.

Recognize Cues	6	83.3%	Filter information from different sources (i.e., signs, symptoms, health history, environment). Identify relevant information related to the client's condition. Use knowledge, experience and evidence to assess clients. Use verbal, nonverbal, written, and electronic modes of communication. Recognize relevant subjective/objective client data. Identify subtle and apparent changes in client condition and related factors.

RN Assessment	8	62.5%	The assessment step of the nursing process involves application of nursing knowledge to the collection, organization, validation and documentation of data about a client's health status. The nurse focuses on the client's response to a specific health problem including the client's health beliefs and practices. The nurse thinks critically to perform a comprehensive assessment of subjective and objective information. Nurses must have excellent communication and assessment skills in order to plan client care.
RN Planning	3	100.0%	The planning step of the nursing process involves the nurse's ability to make decisions and problem solve. The nurse uses a client's assessment data and nursing diagnoses to develop measurable client goals/outcomes and identify nursing interventions. The nurse uses evidenced based practice to set client goals, establish priorities of care, and identify nursing interventions to assist the client to achieve his goals.
RN Implementation/Therapeutic Nursing Intervention	1	100.0%	The implementation step of the nursing process involves the nurse's ability to apply nursing knowledge to implement interventions to assist a client to promote, maintain, or restore his health. The nurse uses problem-solving skills, clinical judgment, and critical thinking when using interpersonal and technical skills to provide client care. During this step the nurse will also delegate and supervise care and document the care and the client's response.

Patient-Centered Care	3	100.0%	The provision of caring and compassionate, culturally sensitive care that is based on a patient's physiological, psychological, sociological, spiritual, and cultural needs, preferences, and values.
