**Main Category: Management of Care**

**Subcategory: Confidentiality/Information Security**

**Topic: Information Technology: Protecting Client Information in the Electronic Health Record**

- Protection of client information is the main goal of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). This law guides practices for the protection of private health information (PHI) (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Electronic health records are protected information. Nurses should know that only members of the team directly involved in care should access the clients chart, passwords should not be shared, medical records should be kept in secure locations, and no photocopies of the information can be made (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Additionally, nurses and staff should know to log off the computer when leaving the work station and change their password often (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

**Main Category: Safety and Infection Control**

**Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis**

**Topic: Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: Identifying National Notifiable Diseases**

- Certain diseases are considered nationally notifiable are require reporting in order to track the disease and the potential to spread and become and epidemic (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- The CDC determines which diseases need to be reported, and this reporting is mandated by state and local regulations (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Nationally Notifiable Diseases are anthrax, botulism, cholera, congenital rubella syndrome, COVID-19, diphtheria, giardiasis, gonorrhea, hepatitis A, B, and C, HIV, influenza-associated pediatric

mortality, Legionellosis/Legionnaires' disease, Lyme disease, malaria, meningococcal disease, mumps, pertussis, paralytic poliomyelitis, nonparalytic poliovirus infection, rabies, rubella, salmonellosis, severe acute respiratory syndrome-associated coronavirus disease (SARS-CoV), shigellosis, smallpox, syphilis, tetanus/ C. tetani, toxic shock syndrome, tuberculosis, typhoid fever, vancomycin-intermediate and vancomycin-resistant, viral hemorrhagic fever, and Staphylococcus aureus (VISA/VRSA) (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

**Topic: Infection Control: Implementing Infection Control in the Home**

- Infection prevention in the home is necessary to prevent infection spread in the community (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Clients should be educated on the need for proper hand hygiene, such as washing their hands regularly. They should also be taught proper cleaning and disinfecting of home surfaces, safe food handling, and safe food storage (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Lastly, patients should be taught to avoid sharing items like towels and toothbrushes and should know to stay home when sick (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

**Main Category: Health Promotion and Maintenance**

**Subcategory: Health Promotion/Disease Prevention**

**Topic: Community Assessment, Education, and Program Planning: Educating Young Adults About STI Prevention**

- Prior to education, the nurse should identify areas of education that are needed and what methods should be used to teach the material (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- The clients should be taught about the need for safe sex practices, such as correct condom use and limiting the number of sexual partners. They should also be taught to get regular testing and communicate with partners after a positive test (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- They should also be taught to receive vaccinations such as the HPV vaccine and receive education on how STIs are transmitted and the signs and symptoms to watch for (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

**Main Category: Psychosocial Integrity**

**Subcategory: Cultural Awareness/Cultural Influences on Health**

**Topic: Community Assessment, Education, and Program Planning: Evaluating Client Understanding of Teaching**

- In order to properly teach the client and evaluate their understanding, the nurse first needs to know their preferred method of learning to adequately teach them the material (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- There are multiple methods of evaluation the nurse can use to determine understanding of the material. These include things like demonstration, questioning, quizzes, feedback, and observation (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- After evaluating their understanding, the nurse should decide if any subjects need to be taught again and identify methods that worked to come up with a plan for continued education (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

**Main Category: Basic Care and Comfort**

**Subcategory: Nonpharmacological Comfort Interventions**

**Topic: Complementary and Alternative Therapies: Evaluate Client Response to Tea Tree Essential Oil**

- Complementary and Alternative Therapies (CAMs) are treatments used to complement conventional Western medicine and help treat people as a whole (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Tea Tree oil is an essential oil used to help treat athlete's foot and other fungal infections (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- To assess if it is working, the nurse should ask if there is a reduction in symptoms like itching, scaling, and burning (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

## Main Category: Clinical Judgment

### Subcategory: Take Action

#### Topic: Emergency Preparedness: Caring for an Adolescent Who Has an STI

- The client should be educated on medication regimens and follow-up testing once their medications are finished (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- The client should be instructed to inform their partners so that they may also get tested and receive treatment if needed (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Lastly, they should be taught about safe sex practices to prevent further infections and spreading of disease (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

### Subcategory: Generate Solutions

#### Topic: Emergency Preparedness: Identifying Interventions to Include in Emergency Response Plan

- First, a risk assessment to identify potential hazards and possible events should occur to determine what plans should be made (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Next, communication protocols should be established, such as who to alert, communication during the event, and who the coordinator is. Additionally, evacuation routes and shelters should be designated, and roles should be identified. These roles should be established so that communication of these roles will be clear (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Lastly, training for that emergency plan should occur and education around the necessary protocols should be identified (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).

### Subcategory: Recognize Cues

#### Topic: Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: Identifying Notifiable Conditions

- Disease surveillance is used to investigate disease patterns and track where a disease started and how it is spreading (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- Certain diseases are considered Nationally Notifiable Diseases, which means they need to be reported to be tracked and notification to others exposed can occur (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
- These diseases include anthrax, botulism, cholera, congenital rubella syndrome, COVID-19, diphtheria, giardiasis, gonorrhea, hepatitis A, B, and C, HIV, influenza-associated pediatric mortality, Legionellosis/Legionnaires' disease, Lyme disease, malaria, meningococcal disease, mumps, pertussis, paralytic poliomyelitis, nonparalytic poliovirus infection, rabies, rubella, salmonellosis, severe acute respiratory syndrome-associated coronavirus disease (SARS-CoV), shigellosis, smallpox, syphilis, tetanus/ *C. tetani*, toxic shock syndrome, tuberculosis, typhoid fever, vancomycin-intermediate and vancomycin-resistant, viral hemorrhagic fever, and *Staphylococcus aureus* (VISA/VRSA) (Assessment Technologies Institute, 2023).
