SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sickle Cell Crisis <ul style="list-style-type: none">• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.

Main Category: Management of Care

Subcategory: Establishing Priorities

Topic: Nursing Process: Priority Action for Infectious Diarrhea

- The nurse should begin replacing fluids and keeping the client hydrated (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should educate the clients on hand hygiene (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should be familiar with the barriers of access to healthcare for vulnerable populations (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Subcategory: Advocacy

Topic: Social Determinants of Health: Providing Care for a Client Who Speaks a Different Language Than the Nurse

- The nurse should use a qualified interpreter in the client's language throughout their care. The nurse should not use a family member to interpret the information (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should provide the client with information and handouts in their language (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should also consider cultural differences when providing care (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Subcategory: Client Rights

Topic: Skin Infections and Infestations: Recommending a Natural Treatment for Lice

- The client's parent should use a nit comb to remove any nits (ATI Nursing, 2023d).
- The comb should be boiled for 10 minutes minimum (ATI Nursing, 2023d).
- Clothing, bedding should be washed in hot water with detergent (ATI Nursing, 2023d).

Subcategory: Confidentiality/Information Security

Topic: Information Technology: Protecting Client Information in the Electronic Health Record

- Only personnel involved with that specific client's care should access their information (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- The nurse should not share their passwords with anyone (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- The nurse should log off of the computer before they leave (ATI Nursing, 2023a).

Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

Subcategory: Emergency Response Plan

Topic: Overview of Community Health Nursing: Identifying Phases of the Disaster Management Cycle

- Mitigation is one phase of the disaster management cycle. This phase focuses on disaster prevention by increasing public health immunizations, isolations, and increasing surveillance in the community. It also focuses on identifying populations at risk and implementing plans to help them during a disaster (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Disaster preparedness is another phase where action plans, communication protocols, and drills are completed (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Disaster response is the phase how the public and agencies respond in the event of a disaster and how to manage it (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis

Topic: Emergency Preparedness: Exposure to Anthrax

- Anthrax is a category A biological agent that is easily transmitted through the air (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Anthrax vaccine can be administered to people who are at a higher risk of exposure (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Antibiotics can be administered to prevent the development of anthrax symptoms following an exposure. Antibiotics that can be used are ciprofloxacin and doxycycline (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Topic: Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: Identifying National Notifiable Diseases

- There are many nationally notifiable diseases that are listed on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

- Some of the diseases include COVID-19, gonorrhea, Hepatitis A/B/C, and HIV (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Other diseases include meningococcal disease, mumps, pertussis, tuberculosis, and diphtheria (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Topic: Infection Control: Implementing Infection Control in the Home

- Clients should be educated on the signs of infection, such as fever, chills, sweating, fatigue, and areas of redness/inflammation (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- The client should be educated on the importance of hand hygiene (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- The client should also be taught about good personal hygiene and keeping their homes clean (ATI Nursing, 2023a).

Subcategory: Home Safety

Topic: Home Safety: Home Safety Evaluation

- The nurse should consider the client's risk factors when evaluating their home for safety (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The client should remove items that can increase their risk of falling, such as loose rugs or clutter on the floor (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The client should place cords against walls and behind furniture and make sure they have adequate lighting (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Main Category: Health Promotion and Maintenance

Subcategory: Health Screening

Topic: Pediatric Emergencies: Identifying Risk Factors for Lead Poisoning

- Lead-based paint can increase the risk of lead poisoning (ATI Nursing, 2023d).
- Lead-based plastics that are used to make some toys can also increase the risk of lead poisoning (ATI Nursing, 2023d).
- Soil can also contain lead that may be accidentally ingested (ATI Nursing, 2023d).

Subcategory: Health Promotion/Disease Prevention

Topic: Older Adults (65 Years and Older): Vaccine Recommendations for Older Adults

- There are many vaccines that are recommended for older adults (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- One vaccine that is recommended is the pneumococcal vaccine (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- Other vaccines include the flu vaccine and Tdap (ATI Nursing, 2023a).

Subcategory: High-Risk Behaviors

Topic: Infections: Counseling a Client Who Has Chlamydia

- The client may experience painful urination, frequency, gray/white discharge, and itching (ATI Nursing, 2023c).
- The client should finish their entire prescription and take it only as prescribed (ATI Nursing, 2023c).
- The client should use a barrier contraceptive each time they engage in sexual activity (ATI Nursing, 2023c).

Main Category: Basic Care and Comfort

Subcategory: Nonpharmacological Comfort Interventions

Topic: Complementary and Alternative Therapies: Evaluate Client Response to Tea Tree Essential Oil

- Complementary and alternative therapies are often used as an addition to improve a client's health (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- These types of therapies have become more popular and can allow clients to become more involved in their treatment (ATI Nursing, 2023a).
- Tea tree essential oil has been used by clients to help treat athlete's foot (ATI Nursing, 2023a).

Main Category: Clinical Judgment

Subcategory: Recognize Cues

Topic: Epidemiology and Communicable Diseases: Identifying Notifiable Conditions

- There are many conditions or diseases that must be reported (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Polio, Lyme disease, SARS-CoV, and smallpox are some nationally notifiable diseases (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- Other diseases include vancomycin-resistant diseases, VRSA, tetanus, and rabies (ATI Nursing, 2023b).

Subcategory: Generate Solutions

Topic: Emergency Preparedness: Identifying Interventions to Include in Emergency Response Plan

- The nurse should be familiar with the facility's disaster management plan (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should also help triage and coordinate evacuation (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
- The nurse should help provide care to the clients until help or evacuation transportation arrives (ATI Nursing, 2023b).
