<p>Level of motivation for learning:</p> <p>The patient was taking a nap before the student nurse entered the room. The student nurse asked the client if presenting the information for this teaching was acceptable at this time and the patient agreed. While the nursing student was presenting this information, the patient was falling asleep and had to be woken up several times to ask questions. This student nurse observed that the patient was not compliant with the teaching due to the nonverbal cues such as falling asleep during the presentation.</p> <p>Barriers to effective learning:</p> <p>A few barriers to effective learning were that the patient was having a hard time communicating to the nursing student due to the left side facial weakness. The student nurse was lip reading the patient due to a communication deficit which can cause a learning barrier.</p>	<p>Nursing Diagnosis:</p> <p>Knowledge deficit related to noncompliance with treatment plans as evidenced by uncontrolled risk factors including uncontrolled hypertension and coronary artery disease (Phelps, 2023).</p> <p>Goal of Teaching:</p> <p>The goal of this teaching will be by the end of the presentation; the client will be able to identify and verbalize two modifiable risk factors for a reoccurring stroke to the nurse. This goal can help the client understand the importance of these modifiable risk factors in preventing a future stroke.</p>	<p>Intervention 1:</p> <p>Make the environment comfortable and free of distractions (Phelps, 2023).</p> <p>Intervention 2:</p> <p>Limit the amount of time of the session to avoid the patient from being overwhelmed (Phelps, 2023).</p> <p>Intervention 3:</p> <p>Use information that is in Lamens terms, so the patient understands the education points (Phelps, 2023).</p>	<p>Method 1:</p> <p>Informational Packet provided by OSF. This packet included pamphlets and packets of information on risk factors for stroke, the pathophysiology of each type of stroke, signs and symptoms of a stroke, and modifiable risk factors for preventing a stroke.</p> <p>Method 2:</p> <p>Teach Back Method</p>	<p>Discuss how the client/family received the teaching:</p> <p>The patient did not have any family at the bedside. The client was not engaged with this teaching plan and would fall asleep while the student nurse was educating the client. The student nurse asked the patient if he had read the informational packet that was provided for him when he was first admitted to the hospital, and he denied reading the packet.</p> <p>Identify strengths/weaknesses of the client or family in receiving teaching:</p> <p>The patient did not have any family at bedside during assessment. Upon evaluation and assessment of the teaching, this student nurse was unable to identify any strengths of the client when receiving the teaching. There were multiple weaknesses that were identified, and these are that</p>
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The patient was taking a nap before the nursing student entered the patient's room so this could be a barrier for effective learning due to drowsiness. The TV was on while the nursing student was teaching, and this caused a barrier in learning due to the sound and possible distraction of the TV. The patient turned off the sound on the TV after a few minutes of teaching.

Health beliefs/values:

The patient denied that he had any health beliefs or values when asked during the assessment.

Psychosocial development:

In the Erikson's Stages of Cognitive Development, this patient would fall into the stage of Stage 7 which is the adulthood period (Orenstein, 2022, para. 12). This stage relates to the patient's age and psychosocial wellbeing (Orenstein, 2022, para. 12).

the patient reports that it hurt to talk so the patient could not report to the student nurse of two modifiable risk factors to prevent a reoccurring stroke. The patient was going to sleep until the student nurse would wake him up again which could cause confusion and misunderstanding from the patient.

Suggest modifications to improve teaching plan (what would have improved the plan?):

Immediately when this nursing student started presenting, she should have turned off the television so the patient could hear the student nurse better. This student nurse would have outlined and highlighted important information that was pertinent to the client in the teaching packet if this teaching plan could have been repeated. The student nurse would reevaluate the timing of when the teaching was performed which could improve the outcome of this
