SAMPLE Topic: Anemias: Discharge Teaching for a Client Who is Recovering from Sick Cell Crisis <ul style="list-style-type: none">• SAMPLE Critical Point #1: Anemia is the abnormally low amount of circulation RB, Hgb concentration, or both.• SAMPLE Critical Point #2: When a patient is going through sickle crisis, the nurse should monitor oxygen saturation to determine a need for oxygen therapy.• SAMPLE Critical Point #3: A patient should have their hemoglobin checking in 4 to 6 weeks to determine efficacy.

Main Category: Management of Care

Subcategory: Advance Directives/Self-Determination/Life Planning

Topic: Professional practice: discussing end of life documents with a client

- A nurse manager attending all the end-of-life care meetings shows fidelity.
- A nurse should listen and answer all questions from a client regarding end-of-life care.
- A nurse should respect any decisions a client makes about their end-of-life care.

Topic: Professional practice: evaluating teaching about advance directives

- The nurse should teach the client that anyone is allowed to be appointed to make end of life care decisions for the client.
- The nurses should let the client know that the advance directives will only be used if the client cannot make their own medical decisions.
- The nurse should understand that different cultures have different ways of planning their end-of-life care.

Topic: Professional practice: teaching about living wills

- A living will outline what specific medical treatment a client wishes to have.
- A living will is for when a client cannot communicate for themselves.
- A living will is a legal recognized document.

Subcategory: Confidentiality/Information Security

Topic: Professional practice: identifying a breach of confidentiality

- **Nurses should be able to identify if a breach of confidentiality is happening.**
- A nurse should know that a clients medical information should not be discussed in public.
- A nurse should recognize that if a client's medical record is seen it is a breach of confidentiality.

Topic: Intervening during a breach of confidentiality

- A nurse should intervene immediately if they notice a breach of confidentiality.
- A nurse should remind the nurse that what they are doing is a breach of confidentiality.
- The nurse should report the breach of confidentiality to the nurse manager right away

Subcategory: Referrals**Topic: Coordinating client care: Assessing the need for a referral**

- A client can be discharged home and still need referrals.
- A physical therapist for a hip replacement is an example of needed referral.
- Involve the patient and family (if wanted by the patient) in the referral process.

Topic: Coordinating client care: Priority nursing action for discharge

- The nurse is responsible for discharge of a patient.
- The nurse should coordinate the discharge with the healthcare team.
- Discharge planning should begin upon admission of the client.

Topic: Coordinating client care: Referral to the occupational therapist

- Occupational therapists help with activities of daily living.
- Occupational therapists can help teach a person to eat again.
- Occupational therapists can help teach a person get dressed again.

Subcategory: Assignment, Delegation and Supervision**Topic: Leading and managing client care: identifying complications of COPD**

- A client with COPD can have anxiety due to not being able to catch their breath.
- A client with COPD can have respiratory infections more often.
- A client with COPD can have sleep issues, including sleep apnea.

Subcategory: Concepts of Management**Topic: Leading and managing client care: quality improvement tools for tracking outcomes**

- Nurse managers should use current data to make the most informed decision.
- Research from a variety of sources should be used in quality improvement.
- Use of evidence-based practice is necessary for quality improvement tools for tracking outcomes.

Subcategory: Advocacy**Topic: Professional practice: client advocacy**

- Client advocacy involves supporting the patient's wishes for care.
- Client advocacy is speaking up if the patient is not getting the proper treatment.
- Client advocacy is putting the patient's best interest forward.

Subcategory: Case Management**Topic: Airway management: discharge planning for client who has tracheostomy**

- Teach the client that the tracheostomy is the stoma/opening for the airway.
- Oral care is very important in a patient who has a tracheostomy.
- The incision for the tracheotomy is through the skin, muscles, and trachea and clean technique should be used when accessing it.

Topic: Spinal cord injury: discharge planning for a client who has paraplegia

- Therapy can be at home or at a facility for a client who has paraplegia.
- A wheelchair and assistive devices will be need for a paraplegic client
- The client's home environment should be modified for the client who has paraplegia.

Subcategory: Informed Consent**Topic: Professional practice: client advocacy**

- An accountability as a basic role of a nurse is client advocacy.
- Advocacy is advocating for the protection and rights of a client.
- A nurse should be an advocate for a patient in regards to informed consent.

Topic: Respiratory diagnostic and therapeutic procedures: assessing client's understanding of pulmonary function tests

- Lung function is determined by a pulmonary function test.
- Breathing difficulties are determined by a pulmonary function test.
- A pulmonary function test measures lung volume and capacity.

Main Category: Safety and Infection Control

Subcategory: Reporting of Incident/Event/Irregular Occurrence/Variance

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: situations regarding an incident report

- If a needlestick occurs, an incident report is required.
- If there is a medication error, an incident report is required.
- If there is a fall or an injury to a client an incident report is required.

Subcategory: Security Plan

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: triage during a disaster drill

- A natural disaster can be a tornado or a flood.
- Victims are triaged using green, yellow, red, and black colors.
- Encourage personal preparedness for clients and families.

Subcategory: Safe Use of Equipment

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: triage during a disaster drill

- The nurse should make sure that the appropriate equipment is available during a disaster drill.
- The nurse should make sure that equipment is inspected regularly.
- Faulty equipment should be removed and reported immediately so it is ready during a disaster drill.

Subcategory: Accident/Error/injury Prevention

Topic: Inclusive and Evidence based care environment: teaching newly licensed nurse about restraint protocol

- Proper monitoring is necessary while a client is in restraints.
- Restraints should be a last resort if all other ways of de-escalation has been exhausted.
- Proper documentation is necessary while a client is in restraints.

Subcategory: Emergency Response Plan

Topic: Culture of safety in delivering care: triage during a disaster drill

- Clients are triaged based on how urgent their injuries are.
- Black is the patient is expected to die; they are not breathing and have massive injuries.
- A nurse should quickly assess the client for the ABC's (airway, breathing, and circulation).

Subcategory: Standard Precautions/Transmission-Based Precautions/Surgical Asepsis

Topic: Leading and managing client care: evaluating room assignments of isolation precautions

- A client should be assigned a room based on the isolation precautions needed.
- If a client has C-Diff they should be on contact precautions.
- If a client has tuberculosis they should be on airborne precautions.

Main Category: Clinical Judgment

Subcategory: Take Actions

Topic: Leading and managing client care: delegating tasks to an AP for four clients

- An AP can measure intake and output for a client.
- An AP can help a client to the restroom.
- An AP is allowed to take vitals on a client.
