

Infographic Worksheet Directions, Outcomes, Rubric, and Example

Directions: Students will be assigned to a group and be asked to create an infographic. The students will be completing this infographic on a mental health condition, which will be pre-approved by the course coordinator. The students should refer to the rubric to determine what information must be included in the infographic. The student groups will be required to present their infographic in class to their peers.

1. What is an infographic worksheet?

An infographic worksheet is a visual representation of information that is used as a visual aid to enhance educational learning by illustrating information.

2. What can be used to present information quickly and clearly when making an infographic worksheet?

The student can use images, graphics, flow charts, pie charts, statistical information, facts, how-tos, anatomical, process, and/or in comparison.

3. How long should an infographic worksheet be?

Brief, one-page sheet, and easy to read.

4. What software programs can I use to create an infographic worksheet?

Resource examples include Word, Google Docs, Canva, and any other resources the student is familiar with utilizing.
