### **1. How does this clinical site relate to the course?**

### **5. What are the health risks of the population served during today's clinical based on your observations today?**

Diabetes, headlice, and meningitis are three of the most common health risks associated with the clinical site.

### **6. Choose one of the health risks identified in question 5 and develop a plan of care to address this.**

**Include a Nursing diagnosis, a measurable goal, and at least 3 Nursing interventions to achieve this goal.**

- **Diagnosis:** At risk for irritation related to the presence of head lice as evidence by nits being found in the hair of the patient.
  - **Goal:** The patient will be free of active life infestation.
  - **Intervention:**
1. Assess the scalp for nits or active lice, being sure to wear the appropriate PPE (Cheever & Hinkle, 2018).
  2. Comb hair with a nit comb (Cheever & Hinkle, 2018).
  3. Assure the patient's nails are trimmed and cleaned. As this will prevent the nits from getting under their fingernails, continuing the spread of lice (Cheever & Hinkle, 2018).

**7.How will your experience during the School Nurse job shadowing impact your Nursing practice?**

I had a good experience. I never knew what a school nurse's job consisted of, so it was very interesting to learn about. It just shows me that there are many different environments for nurses to affiliate with and be able to help others along the way.
