He understands that he has a mental illness and wants to get rid of it. George voluntarily chose to get help at the psych ward. He has an excellent relationship with his peers, staff, and family. His dad would come to visit George all the time. One priority problem that George has is his anger he puts forth at the ward. There were certain times when George was either throwing stuff at the wall or punching the wall. Another priority problem that he has is the voices and hallucinations he sees. The voices in his head tell him that he is worthless. Some of the support groups that George attends at the clinic are seeing the Occupational therapist and taking part in group activities.

Matty is a seventeen-year-old boy that suffers from severe depression and psychotic episodes. He became hospitalized because he hears voices in his head that tell him to end his life. I can tell by Matty's physical appearance that he tries to hide, and he just doesn't look healthy. Matty, like George, understands that he has a mental illness because he voluntarily chose to enter the psych ward for help. Matty's relationship with the staff members wasn't all that good at the start. He really wouldn't say much to them or join in on the activities. He did have a good relationship with his friend named Ryan. One priority that George has is his voices that he hears nonstop in his head. Along with that problem, he is being watched over, so he doesn't commit any harm to himself. One goal that was named for George was to get him into another clinic before he turned eighteen. He was not quite ready to be discharged, and he was turning eighteen, so he had to go to an adult clinic. They eventually were able to get him a bed for an adult clinic on his eighteenth birthday. Another goal that was set for Matty was to limit the voices he hears in

his head. The nursing intervention that was taken was for Matty to attend the activities. These helped him a lot because he was able to understand that he had support behind him. The effectiveness of the nursing interventions was successful. The support groups that Matty attended was the art therapist and the occupational therapist.

Beth has made a lot of progress over the past two episodes. She is now eating on her own and is up to 51 kg. Along with that, she doesn't refuse to get on the scale anymore. She also pretty much stopped all of her self-harming acts she has been committing. One goal that was put forth against Beth was to get herself to stop self-harming herself. Some interventions that took place was the certain support groups that she was able to attend. All in all, it worked pretty well. Beth did have that one mishap right at the end of the episode, but that was it. Another goal was to try to get her taken off the section program. For her to get removed off, she had to consume and gain weight. The nurses and the other staff members helped her realize that it was the only way she was going to get better. Beth started to realize that it was the illness that tried to make her feel guilty for not eating. Beth ended up being taken off the section program, and not long after that, she became discharged.

The safety features at the psych ward were excellent. The clients seemed to put harm to themselves a lot. When this happened, the staff would search their room until the sharp object was found. Also, if someone were violent, they would put them under restraint to protect the other clients and their selves from being harmed.
