What institutions did God establish in the book of Genesis? **The institutions God established was marriage and the law.**

Who has the right to determine what is good and bad? **That is Gods right alone.**

What happened when Adam and Eve took that right? **The basically took the right of determining what is right or wrong upon themselves and away from God.**

Briefly explain why humankind should have freewill? **It gives us a choice to have a relationship with God our creator**

What three things did Satan do in his temptation of Eve? **The three things he did was he questioned the word of God, the second thing he did was he twisted Gods word and the third thing is he weakens the word.**

Who was deceived and who made a willful choice? **Eve was deceived and Adam chose by his own free will.**

How old was Noah when he began to build the ark? **Noah was 600 yrs. old**

What do Noah and the flood foreshadow? **Noah foreshadowed Jesus Christ and the flood foreshadow what Jesus said how it will be in the end times**

When does grace first appear? **Grace appeared when Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord**

How does the ark communicate God's plan of redemption? **The ark communicated God plan of redemption by the way the ark was built. It foreshadowed the finished work of Jesus Christ.**

What extra biblical accounts are there of the flood? **The extra biblical accounts was the Gilgamesh Epic it a non biblical source that confirms there was a Global flood**

Who were the three sons of Noah? **Noahs sons are Shem, ham and Japheth**

Who was Nimrod, what did he do and why is he a type of the antichrist? **Nimrod was the leader of the people that rebelled against God**

What can allow people to accomplish anything? **Unity can allow people to accomplish anything**

Creation -

What are the "gaps" in the classic understanding of evolution? **The gaps in the classic evolution are gaps in geological records and gaps in comparative morphology**

In evolution, what does similarity supposedly show? **In evolution similarities supposedly show common descent that we all descended from the same line**

What does the Biblical record declare about creation coming into being? **Biblical record declare that creation came about by the word of God**

What is the Biblical date for creation and what should our commitment be to that? **The date of creation was in the beginning and we should commit that there was nothing before God.**

What did Augustine argue for? **Augustine argued that there were 3 creative days before God made 24 hour days on the 4th day**

Did God Create from Nothing? -

What is an efficient cause? **An efficient cause is a cause that produces the effect being it produces the effect into existence**

What is the material cause? **A material cause the stuff out of which the effect is made**

What does the doctrine of creation say about the cause of the universe? **The doctrine of creation says the cause of the universe that God is the efficient cause of all reality and there is no material cause**

According to Christianity, how is creation brought into being? **Christianity says that God brought creation into being**

What is one of the most exciting developments in contemporary cosmology? **One of the most exciting developments is that it has brought the doctrine of creation out of nothing to mainstream science and mainstream thinking**

What do all the different cosmological models try to avoid? **The different models try to avoid that the universe cannot be eternal in the past but that there is a past space- time boundary that represents the absolute beginning of the cosmos**

What did three cosmologists discover in 2003? **They discovered that the models cannot be extended infinitely into the past and that there has to be a past boundary at some point that represents the beginning of the universe.**

What can we say with great confidence? **We can say with confidence that there person who believes in the creation that the universe was created out of nothing stands solidly within mainstream science today**

According to Richard Phillips, why did God make the world? **God made the world to display His glory**

Why did God make humankind? **God made mankind to rule for Him in the world**

What pattern do we see in Genesis? **The pattern we see in Genesis is that of a home and a people**

What do we learn from life in the Garden? **We learn from the Garden was that we were made for fellowship with God**

What is the “cultural mandate”? **The cultural mandate means what the Lord wanted us to do which was he put us in the garden the work it and keep it.**

What does bearing God’s image require? **To bear Gods image requires us to be holy and show love**

What other truth does Genesis 2 teach us? **Our obligation to obey God**

What were the results of the first sin? **The results of the first sin were Adam an the woman knew shame and guilt. And the second result was they were alienated from God and fled**

What is the “protoevangelion”? **Was the first Gospel proclamation where God promised that from the woman would come a Savior to undo the damage caused by the Fall.**

What is the biblical pattern for redemption? **The pattern of biblical redemption was when God slew an innocent sacrifice, anticipating Christ’s atonement for the forgiveness of our sins.**

Why did God bring the flood, and what did he do in its aftermath? **God brought the great flood because he saw the wickedness of man was great in the Earth. In the aftermath God made a covenant with Noah, revealing through him His original calling for mankind “ Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth”**

What do we discover in these chapters? **We discover history’s great problem, the problem of sin**

In what way is “God’s rainbow shining still”? **It is shining through Gods grace in Jesus Christ**

What is the “Analogy of Faith”? **The “Analogy of Faith” is when we go through the bible and pick all the verses that are about one topic. Pooling together analogically no matter where it’s at**

What is Biblical theology? **When we go through the bible chronologically.**

What is the “substance” of the covenant? **The substance of the covenant is content of the covenant**

What is repentance? **Repentance is a change of direction complete turn around and head towards Christ**

What is the prevailing theme behind the Flood narrative? **The prevailing them behind the Flood narrative is God bringing order to earth**

What becomes the basis of order? **The basis of order the covenant where God establishes order**

The Date of the Tower of Babel and Some Theological Implications -

Briefly summarize the evidence that Seely uses for the dating of the tower of Babel, the various interpretations of the event and what "divine accommodation" means. Do you agree with Seely's interpretation? Be prepared to argue your position.

The evidence that Seely uses are:

1. The use of bitumen for mortar
2. The archaeological proof that human beings were not speaking the same language at the time of the building of the tower

Divine Accommodation is that God put truths about himself and the world so that we can comprehend what he needs us to know

Genealogy of Adam to the Flood -

How many generations are there (“these are the generations”) Although genealogies were not necessarily literal, if this one (Gen. 6:9) were, can you see the potential reality of a relationship between Noah’s father, Lamech, and the first man, Adam?

The unusually long life spans would facilitate the oral transmission of history from the original source (Adam and Eve) through the generations prior to the keeping of records. Did all of the “godly line” die prior to the flood?

What two types of “beginnings” are given? **The 2 beginnings are: the beginning of the human race and the beginning of the chosen race.**

What are the key verses and the theme of the book? **The key verses are 3:15 and 12:13 the theme is God promises to redeem and bless his people**

Where do we see Christ in the book of Genesis? **We see Christ in Genesis 3: 15, 14:18 and chapters 37-50**
