The purpose of this meeting is to provide an opportunity for support team or expanded support team members to participate in the ongoing review and development of the service plan and the methods used to support the person and accomplish outcomes. A Review of Technology needs for the individual served:

Wayne has no unmet technology needs at this time. Wayne has glasses he wears daily. Wayne uses a CPAP at night due to his sleep apnea with staff assistance. Wayne uses his tablet to Zoom with his family most weeks with staff assistance and occasionally watch videos on it.

A review of the person's service and support outcomes occurred and the following determinations regarding those outcomes were made:

Continue sending letters weekly on Fridays.

Wayne is offered activities he enjoys while at home and staff facilitate such as starting the outside of the puzzles. Wayne prides himself with helping at home by checking the mail, answering the phone, and taking out the garbage at his home. Wayne enjoys writing letters and sending cards to family as holidays come around. Wayne is always interested in outings with housemates, peers, and family.

What are the opportunities for **community access, participation, and inclusion** in preferred community activities?

Wayne and his housemates have outings many weekends when the weather cooperates. Wayne enjoys attending local sporting events and community activities with his housemates. Wayne is always eager to participate in group activities facilitated by MCGH or the ODC. Wayne enjoys regular trips to the library.

What are the opportunities to **develop and strengthen personal relationships** with other persons of the person's choice in the community?

Wayne spends time with peers at the ODC M-Th. Wayne has opportunity to see additional peers at MCGH group activities. Wayne enjoys seeing many members of the community while going out to local community activities and sporting events. Wayne enjoys his time when he goes home to stay with his mom and spend time with his sister.

Due to Wayne's cognitive disability, Wayne is not a candidate for competitive employment at this time..

Other meeting discussion notes:

Home: Wayne spent the winter going to the local basketball games. He continues to enjoy any outing that is going on. Staff have noticed an uptick in behaviors related to not remembering his routine like showers and laundry. He is still able to complete the tasks but often requires prompts and reminders. Wayne likes to take care of tasks around the house like washing the towels weekly. Wayne has been eat food out of the freezer more often than over the last review period. He has taken shredded cheese, tortillas and bread. There have also been containers for things around the house that have gone missing and been found in Wayne's possession like the container for the laundry sheets. Wayne had also taken a paring knife from the kitchen and kept it in his room. Wayne has not done anything to harm himself. Wayne continues to like to leave food out for the birds and the squirrels.

Medical: Nursing report provided by JoAnn, facility nurse. Over the last review period, Wayne has had his regularly scheduled visit with his psych medication management provider with no medication changes. He has recently had his regular dental cleaning. Wayne has his annual neurology visit next month. Wayne has been seizure free now since Jan 2022. Wayne's health care plan was reviewed at the meeting. Behavior report was reviewed and explained.

ODC: ODC documents and plans reviewed. Wayne recently had an incident where he was found with a scissors trying to cut his fingers. He did not harm himself and staff talked with him about the dangers of this. At the ODC, they have seen a vast decrease in the behaviors they were seeing. It seems as though Wayne is able to do what he is instructed to do when given time and space to do so. Wayne likes to spend time in Angel's office with her and he is consistent in changing the calendars at the ODC.

Misc: Mary and Ella Mae have updated the team that they have petitioned the court to remove them as conservators for Wayne. They would stay on as legal guardians. They have not had a hearing to approve this. Mary has also retired as of

Nov 2024. They plan to pick Wayne up for the weekend of Easter. Wayne would like to go to Holy Thursday mass while he is still in Warren that week.

Wayne's Annual meeting is scheduled for Sept 18, 2025 at 1:00p to be held at the ODC.



Staff will draw lines on the outside of the envelope to help Wayne make sure it is legible and not too large. 6- Staff will coach Wayne on where to put his return address label and his stamp. 7- Staff will assist Wayne in bringing him to the post office to mail it or clipping it to the mailbox to be picked up by the mail carrier. 8- Staff will praise Wayne for completing his letter/card and remind him how much his mom or sister will appreciate the mail.


