The purpose of this meeting is to provide an opportunity for support team or expanded support team members to participate in the ongoing review and development of the service plan and the methods used to support the person and accomplish outcomes. A Review of Technology needs for the individual served: Brandie does not have any technological needs that are not currently being met. Brandie has glasses he wears much of the time.

A review of the person's service and support outcomes occurred and the following determinations regarding those outcomes were made:

Brandie has not been wanting to bring his game out of his room at night when he goes to bed however, he says he has not been having trouble getting to sleep and staff have not had consistent issues with him getting up for work.

In the interest of him wanting to have more control over his money. Brandie wants to have a goal to fill out a budget worksheet with staff to plan where he wants his personal needs money to go each month.

What are the opportunities to develop and maintain essential and life-enriching skills, abilities, strengths, interests, and preferences?

Brandie is encouraged to work on independent living skills at home and to be as independent as possible. At Brandie's team meetings, Brandie shared the things that are important to him. It is important to Brandie to work towards living independently.

What are the opportunities for community access, participation, and inclusion in preferred community activities?

Brandie attends most local events with house mates. If there is an event that Brandie is interested in, his staff try to make that happen with appropriate staffing. Brandie has regular outings in the community to the library, local sporting events and going to the movies with staff and housemates.

What are the opportunities to develop and strengthen personal relationships with other persons of the person's choice in the community?

Brandie attends activities coordinated by MCGH. Brandie enjoys seeing his peers in the community. Staff have assisted in coordinating visits at his home with his peers.

What are the opportunities to seek competitive employment and work at competitively paying jobs in the community?

Brandie currently is employed by the City of Warren and has job coaching provided by the ODC..

Other meeting discussion notes:

ODC/employment: Brandie has been taking his blanket and his CD players to relax after he is done with his games on the days he has jobs. He has been bringing his Nintendo Switch to occupy his time while he is at the ODC on the days he does not have jobs. He has been doing his work without concern. He works at the Rec Center, the Fire Hall and Westbridge.

He has a peer that occasionally irritates him when that person is not following the rules. Brandie says that when he hangs out in his back corner space and listens to his music or plays his game, it allows him to stay calmer and not take actions that may get himself in trouble. Brandie shared with his team that his peers come back there to socialize with him. He has a goal to bake at the ODC and that has been going well, and he wants to keep this the same.

Home: Brandie has a new housemate since November. He has gets along good with this housemate. He has many interests in common with this housemate. They play video games together at home.

Brandie has been working with the staff in the home on budgeting his personal needs money. This occasionally has been the source of some arguments between Brandie and staff. It is very important to Brandie to make choices regarding his money. Brandie wants to be able to purchase some things off of his "wish list" but also wants to have enough money for spending on outings during the month. Staff are working on laying out his budget on a worksheet, so he understands where he is deciding for his money to go and what he has left to spend. The team discussed him getting a white board to have to be able to note what money he has left as well as what is left to spend. They also discussed using cash in envelopes to he could visualize the money he had in each category he was budgeting for.

Brandie does not currently complain of having issues sleeping. He has talked about how he likes to sleep on the floor of his closet, saying he thought he was warmer. Staff have advised him to use more blankets.

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Medical: Brandie has had his annual physical since his last meeting and he had no concerns at that appointment. He has been regularly seeing his therapist, Jessica Gaffney and Jason Nupdal, his psychiatric medication management provider. He did have a medication change in November after a series of behavior reports including an incident when he punched a wall at the home. He has had no behaviors at the home since aside from a few disagreements here and there.

Brandie's Annual meeting is scheduled for Sept 11, 2025 at 3p to be held at the ODC.



Put game away	1. Brandie will take his PM medications as scheduled. 2. When Brandie is done playing his game, Brandie will place it in its case and bring it to the counter in the living room. 3. Staff will praise Brandie for working on getting a good night's sleep. 4. If Brandie does not bring the switch out on his own, Staff will ask him if he is ready to go to bed yet. If he is, staff will ask him if he would like to leave his switch out on the counter. 5. If Brandie says he is not ready for bed yet, staff will remind him of his goal he shared to get better sleep so he feels more rested in the morning. Staff can remind him that staying up and playing his game tells his brain it's not time for bed while his medications are telling his brain it is time for bed.


