


Universal Design for Learning Appropriate for Students with Disabilities and for ENLS

What is UDL?



Universal Design for Learning is a set of principles for curriculum development that give all individuals equal opportunities to learn.

The Learning Guidelines below broadly describe the three areas, representation, action and expression, engagement (these were specifically mentioned in the SWD Case study) that are appropriate in ALL classrooms for all learners.
