Among the ten models of helping listed in the book, the three that I personally believe that may apply to the case study of Mrs. Morgan are the medical modern (2), problem-solving (3), and the personal responsibility model (7). The reason I selected these three is that I believe the main issue of Mrs. Morgan was lying on being old and started to act according to her age, it wasn't anything that was too extra.

Model two (2) would describe the situation as a normal reaction because as it states in the document entitle Monica case study some of the health issues she has was due to her age, and she was feeling hopeless because she wasn't able to function as she used to when she was young. The ideology of this model would be that because she was not taking her medication properly the daughter thought that if she moved her to her place that will help her to be more responsible in taking her pills and maybe feel less hopeless. However soon after she moved her she realizes that was a big mistake because she wasn't happy with her decision. The helper in this model the daughter is seeking help through social services as she doesn't what to do to make her mother understand that it was for her own benefit she acted the way she did, maybe they could help facilitate their relationship better. The recipient of this model will be patient and is attrubute to nursing social work.

Model 3 would describe the situation as there is a problem so how do we solve it, the problem would be the mother is upset with the daughter because she is removed from her house

and come to stay with the daughter but technically end up of still staying alone when the husband and the daughter went to work. Then the ideology would be to make the daughter understand that her mother has all the reason to be upset because if she knew there wasn't anybody to take care of her why removed her at first, and suggested to her what action she can take to solve the issue, the helper is still patient as for this model; the recipient could be social work or a psychology.

Model 7 is the most effective in this case study for me because it will demonstrate how irresponsible was the daughter to live her mother in the house even by knowing her age, her health condition, and the risk. Obviously, she can't say she did not know the risk because the elderly mind does not function as a young mind she could get up and live the house, she could set the place in fire.
