The Pentateuch is the first five books of the bible. Also known as the 'Torah' or the first five books of Moses.

. Genesis is the first book of the bible- The purpose of Genesis is to show the beginning to where the creation, universe, and earth started. God made humans out of his image. The book shows the failure and disappointment of God's people. God gives us a choice to trust his definition of good and evil or our own definition of good and evil. The book of Genesis also shows us the starts of God's covenant, blessing, redemption, and unfilled promises.

. Exodus is the 2nd book of the bible- The purpose of exodus was the foundation of how God was to reveal himself to the world by setting his enslaved people free from the bondage of Pharaoh. God continued his covenant on Mt. Sinai to the Israel lights. There is where we received the 10 commandments. The book of Exodus also shows us how sin can damage our relationship with God.

. Leviticus is the 3rd book of the bible- The purpose of levities is the guide for teaching, rebuking, and correcting God's people to live holy and worship him. It also reminds us of our sins and how God will graciously provide a way for his people to live in his presence again.

. Numbers is the 4th book of the bible- The purpose of numbers is to journey through God's promise land into the wilderness. the people's disobedience and lack of faith caused God to make them wander in the desert until all the people of that generation had died. Numbers are an account of Israel's stubbornness.

Deuteronomy is the 5th book of the bible- The purpose of Deuteronomy is God's people were about to enter the Promised Land, Deuteronomy gives a stern reminder that God is worthy of worship and obedience. It also retells the covenant between God and his people of Israel, presented in three addresses or sermons by Moses.
