### Romans 8

As we look Romans 8 we see three break down within the text we first see from verse 1-11 the freedom from sin: the spirit role in the gospel. Then in verse 12-17 talks about the spirits role in the gospel and finally verse 18-30continuest to speak on the role in the gospel. So first we will look at verse 1-11 when we examine Romans 8, we see the continuing of chapter 7 and in Roman 8 is going in more depth of the freedom from sin. Paul speaks about that believers are now free from the death in a result our sinfulness and because of that the spirit has free us. Also find that the Spirit brings both restoration to life in the present and the promise of the future. In the reading this stood out to me it says “right away, Paul jumps into the thought previewed by his interjection in 7:25a. Leaving off his speaker from 7:7-25, Paul emphasizes the contrast for him and his audience. Unlike the I, here believers are saved from their bodies of sin – caused death (8:1 ,7:24) {pp.402}. Also, while we are studying the word of God it is especially important to look at the language because the language make a better understanding of the text you are reading. Another thing that stood out to me while reading was when it says, “according, the governing idea of Rom 8:1-11 is that unlike the I, sinners who are righteousized in the gospel are no longer condemned to death by their sinfulness. And this is not just an ancillary aspect of righteousization” {pp.413}.

Now we will look at Romans 8:12-17 we are continuing the Spirit role and we that Paul explains the spirit transformation of believers in God heir. In the book it says “the primary point of Paul and his audience are not owned by their flesh, but are instead owned by the Spirit; Paul fills out each half of this contrasting pair with a pair of parallel conditionals that make explicit how these two ownerships result in either death or life (vv.12-13) {pp.417}. We the concept of Paul because of the spirit and God divine son Christ Jesus is a sonship. And we are now under royalty because of Jesus Christ we are no longer sinner because he paid our debt on the cross. And finally, we will be looking at Romans 8:18-30 continuing the spirit role in the gospel. Paul explains the relationship between our suffering in Christ Jesus and living in Christ. On our walk in Christ Jesus seems hard at times because we look at the problem instead of looking at the person, we already fix it and what is interesting that Jesus stayed connected with God in everything he did because he knows that he holds his strength is and he puts all his trust and faith in His father, and we need to do that daily. And what is remarkably interesting we have access to that because of Jesus Christ and have direct access to the Father and we are no longer subject to sin. But you must recognize who you are and who you belong too. Another thing that stood out to me while reading was “ God and the Spirit share communion , so that God knows both believers hearts and the Spirits aims goals (mind v27)”{pp.438}.
