1. American Art – comes from the United States. It shows a wide variety of styles and methods of art. It contains Paintings of realistic portraits and landscapes, sculpture, art of indigenous peoples, photography and graphics.

2. Perspective- This artwork is 2-D but the technique makes the piece have height, depth and width.

3. Exhibition- A public display of art in a gallery or a museum.

4. Mobiles- An art structure that is suspended so that it can turn in the air.

5. Deceiving the eye- This is also known as tromp l'oeil art. This type of art makes you think that an illusion is real.

6. Canvas- A strong cloth used to make a painting.

7. One dimensional- Something that is flat and has no depth.

8. Two dimensional- This art has length and width but not depth.

9. Three dimensional- This art has length, width and depth

10. Native Americans – A member of the first group of people living in North America or South America.

11. Eskimos- Indigenous that live in Alaska or Canada

12. Arts and Craft Movement- This movement tried to change mid-19th century Art. It went against (didn't like) machinery or factory. They wanted to improve decorative cultural values. These values that a group of people make their morals, languages customs and roles.

13. Embroidery – Decorative art that is used to embellish fabric. Materials that are used are beads, paint, thread, quills feathers.

14. Totem Pole – A painted log, displayed vertically, made by Native Americans on the North West coast of the United States and Canada. They show symbolic animals and spirits.

15. Inuit- A member of indigenous people of northern Canada and Alaska.

16. Romanticism- An 18th century movement in the arts that expressed nature and imagination.

17. Naturalism- Painting or drawing from the natural world such as things in the environment. This art form does not accept things that are not real.

18. Exhibition- A public display of work at an art gallery or museum.

19. Landscape- Art Artwork that shows the features of an area of land, its formations and everything that is natural.

20. Rocky Mountain School- A school of art featuring Thomas Moran which focuses on Nature.
