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Who is Jesus

The author examines who did Jesus think he was, what would the average Galilean have perceived as Jesus came through the village and how Jesus asked the disciples Who do people say I am?. Wright described How Jesus never once uses the title "messiah " to describe him , and also about all his teaching for the kingdom of God, he explained how his crucifixion was the shocking answer to the prayer that God's kingdom would come on earth as in heaven, and how Jesus describe himself as the son of man.

Who did Jesus imagine himself to be? Psalm 110 and Daniel 7 are referenced in Jesus' statement to the high priest. He says "from this moment," implying that as soon as he is sentenced to death, his crowning or coronation as the Son of Man, who will immediately sit at the "right hand of the Father," will begin. After that, Jesus was crucified and given a robe and a crown of thorns. This is the moment he is crowned King of the Universe.

Who did Jesus think he was 'Jesus Himself Jesus' understood the speculation about His identity. He asked His disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" Peter gave the right answer: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" Matthew 16:1. Jesus affirmed the truth of Peter's answer and promised that, upon that truth, He would build His church. When Jesus says this, he is declaring that he is the Son of Man, but he does use Daniel 7 Son of Man language. Instead, he speaks in Father/Son terms. Jesus is implying that just because people don't identify him as the Son of Man, that doesn't mean he isn't the Son of Man. It was at this moment in Jesus' human

growth that he realized he was the Messiah. In addition, Jesus never uses the term "messiah" to describe himself. When people heard what Jesus said, for example, how he 'educated them as one who had authority, not as a teacher of the law,' and when they observed his miraculous power, they were compelled to grapple with the question: who is this Jesus? Up until the time of his crucifixion, Jesus' own narrative of his origins remained unknown. His nature has become an issue after the resurrection and ascension, as the early Christians battled to find the perfect word to represent it. Since then, the world has been shocked and horrified by the subject of Jesus' person and nature.

Who is this mysterious "son of Man"? In summary, Daniel 7 is a vision of four horrible animals emerging from the sea one by one to devour the earth, including Israel. The beast's authority is then taken away, and Daniel describes what he saw: in his vision before him was one like a son of man, approaching with the clouds of heaven. He was led into the presence of the Ancient of Days as he approached him. All countries and peoples of every tongue loved him as he gave authority, glory, and sovereignty power.

This article taught me that Jesus' death was witnessed by him, and that his crucifixion and death are proof of our justification, cause of our sanctification, and pledge of our glorification. The route to heaven is now made visible through Christ's crucifixion and sufferings, and it is the hope of our eternal and complete victory and the door of hope that will make us sing and triumph over death.
