

Describe how you maintain your walk with the Lord so that it stays fresh and alive for you to follow Jesus.

Walking with the Lord and maintaining followership with Him is both an easy and a difficult thing to do. Easy because God works in us to do his good pleasure and challenging because we have our flesh, our moral imperfections, and weaknesses to deal with every day. Despite the difficulty in carrying our cross daily, the consolation often comes from the glorious provision of meeting Christ, the good shepherd for he says In Matt 11v28-30 Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. 29Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. 30For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

Some ways in which I maintain my work with the Lord that it stays blooming and healthy is:

First, I often try as much as I can to know his words. Studying the scripture often helps keep my walk with the Lord fresh as it reminds me daily of his sweet promises and serves as a light unto my feet to guide me through this morally dark and sinful world.

Second, I often try to communicate with my Lord in the place of prayer. Prayer is essential to the life and fellowship of every Christian believer. Without frequent communication (two-way communication) with God, I find myself quickly overwhelmed by the affairs and troubles of this world. However, in the place of prayer, I find consolation, peace, and rest in the Lord.

Lastly, as the scripture admonishes in the book of Hebrew 10vs25, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." Having fellow believers with a single heart towards the Lord is a helpful way to keep my walk with the Lord fresh. The scripture tells us in Eccl 4vs12, "Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken". Community is also essential to my walk with my savior.
