Review for Intro to Visual Arts - Review sheet 2.

Colonial Architecture -adapted to the materials and climate of a region in the colonies. Materials that were used for building were wood in the northeast. In other areas, reeds, grasses and twigs were used.

New Orleans and Florida were the only areas where experienced builders were sent to construct buildings.

Beaux Arts- A type of architecture that came from Roman and Greek forms. It started in the US in the Late 19th century and early 20th century. It included elements such as columns, pediments and balconies.

Neo Classical Architecture - took place during the 18th and early 19th centuries. It emphasized blank walls, columns, horizontals and verticals. The White House is an example of Neo Classical architecture.

Gothic Architecture - is English based. It is seen in churches and homes. This style showed pointed circles,steep gables, and towers. An example of this architecture is St. Patrick's

Cathedral.

John Washington Roebling designed the Brooklyn bridge. His wife finished the final construction.

Photography began in the late 1830's in France .

Daguerre type was a photographic style that began with a style was the beginning of the current photograph. It was fine by making an image on a plate.

Once portable cameras were developed, photographers were able to show citizens pictures of war.
