Introduction to Visual Art

Harlem Renaissance - intellectual and cultural revival of African American music, dance, art, fashion, and literature. It took place in Harlem, NY between 1920 -1939.

Great Migration - When African-American workers left the south because of discrimination and moved north. This was the start of the Harlem Renaissance.

Artists of the Harlem Renaissance:

Aaron Douglas - painter

Meta Warwick- painter and sculptor

James Van de Zee - photographer

Jacob Lawrence - painter

Pop Art - A movement that started in England and in the US in the mid- 1950's. It utilized images from popular culture such as Campbell soup cans, coke bottles, movies and comic books.

Pop Art artists:

Andy Warhol - known for his work art work with Campbell soup cans and Coke bottles.

Roy Lichtenstein - painted the world as a comic strip.

Klaus Oldenburg - took everyday objects and made them very big and used them be as art.

Dadaism- An art movement that started after the 1st World War. It was a protest against the horrors of the war. This artwork was based on machines and the Industrial Revolution.
