When I reread the question then I found out that I read it wrong and was able to select the right word and where the comma should be.

The correct way to write this sentence:

Jean always nibbles around the pit of a cherry, just as if she were eating a **peach. Because** she is vain about her **smile, she** does not **want to** chip a tooth on the center.

The comma between **smile** and **she** stays the same.

Now after the word peach it should have a period at the end of the sentence and the word **Because** should be a capital '**B**'.
