

Choose one of the three questions below. In MLA format, type or write a 5 paragraph essay answering the question you chose. The essay should be double-spaced and around 425-500 (2 pages) words.

1. **Choose One** – a), b), c), or d) about *The Prince of Egypt*

a) Discuss a theme that interested you in *The Prince of Egypt*. What message does the film communicate about the theme you chose. Some examples of themes include: freedom, adventure, love, family, grief, promises, heroes, etc. Support your answer with details from the film.

b) Discuss what the film *The Prince of Egypt* communicates about life. What does the film communicate is important in life? Support your answer with details from the film.

c) Discuss the musical score for the movie *The Prince of Egypt*. What scenes do you remember the music from? Support your answer with details from the film.

d) Chose a character from the film. How does the film portray that character? What motivations are provided for that character – why do they do the things they do? What emotions drive their behaviors? Support you answer with details form the film.

e) Compare and Contrast the biblical story in Exodus with the story in the film. What is similar? What is different? In what ways does the meaning shift or change or not? Discuss what you notice and what you think it means. Support your view with details from the film.

f). Discuss how female characters are portrayed in the film. You can compare and contrast them from the biblical portrayal. Or choose another idea about the female characters that interests you. Support your view with details from the film.
