

24. People exhibiting odd personality disorders are similar, but still distinguished from schizophrenia. These eccentric personalities are often classified as paranoid, schizoid, and schizotypal personality disorders. The symptoms of these disorders include social withdrawal and thinking or perceptions that others in typical culture might view as peculiar. It is often the individual's atypical behavior that lends the individual susceptible to isolation. It is reported that people with odd-cluster personality disorders rarely seek treatment. Paranoia is often in display with those individuals experiencing delusional behavior which makes trust and loyalty quite challenging. These individuals are often viewed as quite cold and removed. People with this disorder are critical of weaknesses and faults in others while quick to neglect what could be wrong in their own lives. This makes criticism difficult to absorb from external sources.

Dramatic personality disorders are a separate cluster from "odd/eccentric". These disorders include antisocial, borderline, histrionic and narcissistic personality disorders. Antisocial personality disorder is one of the number one disorders associated with criminal activity, as well as substance use disorders. Usually these individuals have a careless regard for their finances or are more likely to leave a job quickly. This is mostly due to the impulsivity of their decision making. This also correlates to their tendency towards aggression and starting fights. Individuals with antisocial disorder often have an overlapping diagnosis of substance use disorder, have trouble with the law, and display reckless behaviors. There appears to be a desire for thrill seeking behavior and taking risks.
