CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION: GCN 522 OA – Foundations of Mental Health Counseling - Online (3 credits) An overview of the field of mental health counseling. The history and philosophy of the profession, as well as the roles and responsibilities of the clinician, will be explored. This course is a mandatory first-semester course and will serve as one of the benchmarks in assessing students' dispositions and suitability for the profession. This course emphasizes the key CACREP areas of Professional Counseling Orientation and Ethical practice. This class will consist of ten (10) synchronous meetings online and four (4) asynchronous.

ASSIGNMENT DESCRIPTIONS:

For this course, all ten (10) weeks will be open and available on E360 as of 01/02/2023. The purpose of this is to facilitate learners the possibility of working ahead on assignments if they choose to do so. However, students must adhere to the due dates listed below and E360 (they may be completed BEFORE, but NOT AFTER a due date). All due dates and times are listed in Eastern Standard Time (EST).

1. Participation and Attendance ~ (5% / 5 points):

- **Participation & Attendance is obtained over the course of the semester.**

The major methods of learning in this class are Lectures, Assignments, Text Reading, and Discussions, with ten (10) 2-hour synchronous meetings on Mondays (7:00 – 9:00 PM EST) starting Monday 01/23/2023 through Monday 05/01/2023.. Before each meeting, assignments and/or chapter reading must be reviewed and completed. The time together will be used for presentations, activities, discussion, exercises, questions, etc. Therefore, everyone's attendance and participation are necessary. You are permitted **one excused absence** (you will need to send an email to the Instructor before class for the reason of the absence at least two hours before class is scheduled to meet) during the course semester (there may be a loss of points at professor's discretion). However, the **second absence** will constitute a considerably lower grade and a **third absence** will constitute excessive absences and a **non-passing grade**. Please be on time; points will be deducted for attending the session late. Attending late disrupts the flow of the class, and you will miss a very important part of our class at the beginning of the session. If the computer you are using does not have a working internal or external microphone and camera, at all times, by the first synchronous session, you will need to drop this course. **Please be sure you have a place to attend to the class, you should not be working, driving, or distracted. Students are to be present as if attending a live class. Cameras on devices must be on at all times and microphones should be muted when you are not speaking.**

2. Discussion Questions Post ~ (10% / 10 points total : 1 point for each Discussion)

- **Discussion Questions are to be complete as noted on the syllabus course calendar**

Each student will complete 10 Discussion Questions throughout the course. The purpose of this activity is to have each student be a part of the discussion for the specific weekly assignment/chapters.

The purpose of the discussion questions is for students to have an intelligent dialog with their fellow classmates. Post your opinion on the topic and incorporate the chapters' content into your answers to show that you are learning the material. It is a post that displays significant importance, value, validity, solidity, and independence of thought. It is a response that adds depth and breadth to a discussion. It includes proper grammar and spelling. It directly addresses the question and does not "go off on a tangent." Quotes and references to course materials or other reference materials are required to allow other students to learn by your example and should be cited in APA 7th edition format at the bottom of your post.

After posting your initial response, please comment on two (2) classmates' posts. (Both your initial post and your response posts should be a minimum of 50-100 words for the possibility of receiving the full amount of points possible). Please respond by making constructive responses. When I say to respond to two (2) other classmates' initial posts, I am looking for more than "That's true" or "I agree" type of responses. I want you to explain your answers. Provide us with details or evidence of why you chose to respond the way you did. If you disagree, tell us why and how you developed this answer. Quotes and references to course materials or other reference materials are required to allow other students to learn by your example and should be cited in APA 7th edition format at the bottom of your post.

Discussion questions posts are due on the dates indicated in the course calendar of this syllabus. Be mindful of dates and times noted in E360 for posting of Initial Post and your Response Post.

3. APA Quiz ~ (10% / 10 points):

Due in Dropbox in E360 by 9:00 pm on Monday, February 6, 2023.

The quiz includes 10 multiple choice questions pertaining to the APA 7th edition tutorial, book and links provided below and in the course build in Week 3 Lesson. Students will view the links provided below and their content in order to learn and prepare for quiz content. Students are required to read and study the APA Publication 7th Edition related to these tutorials in preparation for their quizzes. Students are advised to watch the tutorials more than once and take notes to prepare. The exam will cover important APA Style Basic Rules of format writing. Note this is a preparation for the formatting requirements for the paper assignments for this course.

4. Assignment: Counselor Identity Paper ~ (20% / 20 points):

Counselor Identity Paper Due in Dropbox in E360 before or by 9:00 PM on March 6, 2023.

This paper is to serve as a self evaluation of your perceptions and hypotheses concerning the Counseling Profession. As a newly matriculated AGSC student, you have considered a career of mental health counselor for your profession and career. For this assignment, you will complete a counselor identity paper including your beliefs about the helping professions (psychology, counseling, social work, etc.). You will utilize the questions below as a guideline in preparing your paper. The purpose of this paper is for you to consider your personal beliefs regarding the helping professions and the professional practice of counseling in conjunction with your desired goals in mental health counseling.

This is a personal reflection paper (essay), not a research paper. Therefore, your responses to the questions will be in your own words (**first person**). You will be **expected to include citations and a reference page** for works cited. Note a rubric will be attached to the lesson and in the resources section for your review along with further guidelines for completion of this paper. **Please organize your paper by selecting and answering 8 of the 11 questions below:**

1. How do you define the role/job of a professional helper? Define this in your own words. Be thorough in your response.

2. What has led you to consider the helping fields?
3. Based on your beliefs, experiences, etc., what are the 3 most important things a counselor does during a counseling session?
4. Based on your beliefs, experiences, etc., what are the 3 most important things a counselor does not do during a counseling session (do not simply state the opposite of your response above)? Be thorough.
5. What two or more personality characteristics of yours do you believe may serve as personal strengths in your role as a helping professional.
6. What two or more personality characteristics of yours do you believe may serve as personal barriers in your role as a helping professional?
7. With what client population do you think you would have the most success counseling? Explain why thoroughly.
8. With what client population do you think you would have the most difficult time counseling? How do you think you would deal with this when that particular client comes to you asking for your services?
9. How would you define the appropriate dress code for the setting in which you hope to work?
10. Many helping professionals consider themselves to be *role models* in the community, even when they are not “on the clock” at their work setting. Are there any behaviors you believe helping professionals should expressly avoid doing, even when they have their “civilian hats” on? Explain them and your reasoning behind your opinion.
11. Self-care is a particularly important task of the helping professional. How do you plan to take care of yourself and prevent professional *burnout* as you enter the helping profession of Mental Health Counselor?

The paper should be **no more than** 8-10 pages (for the body of the report) using APA guidelines (Note: page count does NOT include the cover page or reference page). An abstract is not necessary for this assignment, but citations, running head, cover page, page numbering, and headings should strictly follow APA 7th edition guidelines. **If you are not experienced with writing in APA 7th edition, that you reference the APA 7th edition manual frequently, and that you reach out to the Student Writing Center for assistance.** The paper should be professional writing and avoid colloquial speech. **This Professor is VERY PARTICULAR about grammar and APA style structure, and it will impact your grade if this is not up to graduate student levels. DO NOT SIMPLY WRITE THE QUESTIONS OUT AND ANSWER THEM!** You will be summarizing the information you receive in an essay form.

5. **Mid Term: State Licensure Requirements & Professional Organization Response (4-6 pgs total)**
~ (25% /25 points total)

- 5A: State Licensure Requirements Response Instructions 15 points

Go to the your state's mental health counseling licensure requirement website (link provided in E360 under Week Lesson 9). Through your state's website information research the state's definition of **Mental Health Counseling**, as well as the requirements mandated to become a licensed Mental Health Counselor. Download a copy of the application for licensure and become acquainted with the type of questions you will be expected to answer upon completion of your degree. **Write a 2-3-page response** (no more) answering each of the following questions:

- What is the role of an LMHC or an LPC?
- What is the protected scope of practice?
- What are the educational and experience requirements?
- How does the state define "be of good moral character"?
- What is the licensing exam that is required and when can you sit for it?
- What does the exam entail? You will need to do research on this question.
- When should I complete the application for permit/licensure?

Any questions omitted will result in point reduction. Please be concise yet thorough in your descriptions of each question. You may use bullet point format if you wish.

- **5B: Professional Organizations Reaction Instructions 10 points**

You will write a paragraph on each organization indicating the membership benefits & fees, and the annual events that each organization offers to its members. If the organization has divisions, select and explain which division(s) would be of interest to you and why?

Write an **additional 2-3-page response** (no more) answering the above noted questions. You may choose to use a **bullet point** in responding to each criteria individually or **essay** format where you integrate your responses.

**6. Final Assignment: RESPECTFUL MODEL of Counseling & Development Self-Assessment (8-10 pgs)
~ (30% /30 points total)**

Response is due in Dropbox in E360 by 9:00 pm on Monday, May 1, 2023.

The RESPECTFUL MODEL is presented via PowerPoint and a Resource Attached in E360 from the 5th Ed. of Theories of Counseling & Psychopathology: A Multicultural Perspective introduced in Counseling & Development (D'Andrea & Daniels, 1997; 2001).

Students will conduct a multi-dimensional self-assessment based on the RESPECTFUL model of counseling and development. This self-assessment should be no less than 8 and no more than 10 pages, double-spaced APA format style. Students will write a detailed description of themselves as it relates to each component of the model described in the E360 article provided in Lesson 14:

Grading Rubric:

- E-economic class background
- S- sexual identity
- P-level of psychological maturity
- E-ethnic/racial identity
- C chronological/developmental challenges
- T- threats to well-being and trauma
- F-family background and history

COURSE POLICIES

- **Attendance/Absence:** For online courses, instructors are to have 45 hours of instruction for every credit hour, which is demonstrated through the Carnegie Unit explanation in this syllabus. Attendance is taken once a week based on the student's interaction in the online course, as determined by threaded discussions, submitted papers, quizzes/exams, and/or synchronous class sessions. Attendance will be marked in the Faculty Portal for those students who have demonstrated participation based on that week's interaction in the course. Missing any class time is detrimental to students and should be avoided. Students, however, are permitted one hour of absence (excused or unexcused) for each credit hour before grading penalties are imposed. Missing 3 classes will result in a failing grade.
- **Late Assignments/Extensions:** Employers will not accept late work. Therefore, in preparation for your future successful career, every effort must be made to submit work on time. A deduction of a letter grade (e.g., A to A-, B+ to B) will be made in the gradebook for each business day the assignment is late, regardless of work quality. Assignments cannot be handed in past the last day of the class, unless an extension request was approved by the Professor and filed with the Registrar's Office no later than the last day of the class.

Peer Writing consultants, who are fellow Nyack College students and alumni, are trained to help with all stages of the writing process, from brainstorming to organizing to revising and editing papers. Plan well in advance to bring the assignment sheet, or a draft of the paper, and specific questions/concerns to any of the Center's locations. Students are also able to have access to online consultations through Google Docs via their nyack.edu email account. The Center's services are free. Students can drop in and work with a consultant or make an appointment through the website or by calling the Center.
