**Frame it yourself two: Hierarchies in a Global System.**

We live in a society in which we all think differently, each of us has our priorities, desires, wishes, and concerns, but in terms of a community, the key is to get the support of other people or create a working group to facilitate the achievement of a single goal in order to live in harmony. The hierarchy is a way of organization in which a subordination of the elements with respect to the superior step is applied, that is to say, a structure where each element is subordinated to the previous one. This type of organization has been used for many years; in fact, it was widely used in the Late Agrarian Era, the era we will talk about today.

Depending on the place, the one who had more power had a different name (king, emperor, sultan, etc.), but all of them had something in common, the first challenge of any community that was going to start its hierarchy was to create a unified elite that would be obedient to the future leader, since only by having that elite, they would have the security that the leader would not be betrayed and therefore everything would be in peace. In most places they saw these leaders as holy, perfect people.

I was very interested in what was said about the American World, in this case, after the Spanish conquest of the Aztec and Inca community, the Spaniards were victorious and took power, but since in both cases they were scarcer in quantity, the management of the administration had to be divided with the indigenous people. Those under power had to abide by what the authority said; otherwise they would have to pay for it. As time went by, one of the ways to know who the next ruler would be, was to determine who

possessed the most material goods. Another very important thing was the arrival of African slaves who were not entitled to anything.

Since I am Peruvian, I can say that there are many differences to what happened before. First of all, now there is democracy, that is, we can choose who comes to power, and this decision is usually based on how capable we think the person is and how well we think this person is going to govern, which speaks about the rights we have as people. Also there is no longer a distinction for being of a different type of accent, or where we come from or what we look like, it is all about us being human and having the same rights. The power is still distributed by a hierarchy, but as I said before, this is also chosen by the people and a series of rules that prevent situations that may threaten this, for example nepotism. One of the similarities I could find is that many people deify the people in power, so when they do something wrong they do not recognize it and can become very extreme with their opinions.
