Check that axillary temperature is between 96.8-99.3 F daily. 3. Discuss signs and symptoms of infection with the parents. 4. Ask the parents to recite 3 common signs and symptoms of infection back to you. 5. Emphasize the importance of breastfeeding every 2-3 hours. 6. Ensure that the parents know to keep the baby in a clean environment. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This will prevent foreign bodies from entering the wound. 2. This is a hallmark sign of infection. 3. This is useful for proper intervention if needed. 4. This displays knowledge and awareness of the issue. 5.
