

My patient today is a 70s female. The patient has pulmonary lung nodule. She doesn't have oxygen catheter, IV, and urine catheter. The patient has IV on her hand but it was not operating. Patient does not have allergy and patient is taking potassium with water, cholesterol medication. Patient had bowel movement and voiding last day night. Patient has no skin irritation and patient has high fall risk. Patient's fall risk grade is 50. Patient's braden scale was graded. The patient walk occasionally and there is limited mobility. Patient's blood pressure and vital sign is 120/76, temperature is 95F, pulse is 69, oxygen is 99%. After assess lung auscultation, patient has weak crackle sound. Patient is going to be discharged on Saturday. Before the patient discharge, the patient need to take lung biopsy. Lung biopsy is procedure in which samples of lung tissue are taken to determine if lung cancer or disease is present. After the biopsy, doctor is going to have plan for further treatment. Also, this patient needs fall risk education, and caregiver when she need to go to the bathroom. I recommend walker, cane, and assistance when patient need to go to bathroom.
