Comparing Societies

The Hittite Kingdom was established in around 1750 BCE in central Anatolia, or Asia Minor. The Hittite economy ran on pastoralism and agriculture. The army also consisted of warrior elites with access to chariots. Strong network connections influenced the Hittite world as well, keeping isolation from becoming the norm. The warrior elites who had a lot of influence at the time, were known for running the administrative systems that existed at the time. Thus, the king would present himself as a successful war leader, with of course the cultural frame of divine intervention through the king being taken into account as well. It was very common for kings to be seen as religious figures.

Compared to societies like the Hittite Kingdom, the United States is very different in the way it is structured. For starters, various goods run the economy that we don't find during the Agrarian era. There are five different industries that keep the United States economy running. Healthcare, technology, construction, retail and non-durable manufacturing(oil, electricity and clothing).
