37. A prototype is what we associate in our minds that put things into different category based on how we identify them as an individual. For example, a prototype could be how one perceives chicken to be cooked. If the individual is used to chicken being curried, then they will automatically prototype chicken to Curry chicken in a meal.

38. Natural concepts are both things associated, Experienced, an authentic to one's individual being in everyday life. Natural concepts are those things that affect the person everyday life due to observation of their current environment. For example, people living in Alaska is used to six months of sun and then six months of darkness due to their location on the earth and how it spins on its axis.

45. Event schema is the general routine of everyday life or the expected reaction regarding someone's behavior based on their environments. For example, when in a classroom everyone sits facing the blackboard depending on how the teacher has the classroom set up. If all the chairs are facing the front, then it's normal for the students to then face the front of the classroom and the directions of the chairs and how they are organized.

50. The evidence that children learn language from an early age has been perceived by the way newborns react to their mother's voice and appeared to have some
