SUBJECT: WHAT IS THE AUTHOR TALKING ABOUT

COMPLEMENT: WHAT IS THE AUTHOR SAYING ABOUT WHAT HE IS TALKING ABOUT?

1. Scripture: Luke 17:1-10
2. Subject: Who are the disciples of Jesus who experience offense or are sinned against?
3. Complement: Those who should always forgive those who repent
4. Main Idea: The disciples of Jesus who experience offense or are sinned against should always forgive those who repent.

1. Scripture: Isaiah 7:1-17
2. Subject: How will God show the house of David his faithfulness?
3. Complement: Through a sign that a virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will be called Immanuel.
4. Main Idea: God will show the house of David his faithfulness through a sign that a son would be born of a virgin and be called Immanuel

1. Scripture: 1 Peter 5:1-4
2. Subject: How should the elders of the church shepherd the people?
3. Complement: By being willing to not pursue dishonest gain, but be eager to serve; and not lord it over those who entrusted to you, but be examples to the flock.
4. Main Idea: The elders of the church should shepherd people by being willing to serve without expecting reward and be examples to the flock through serving unselfishly.

1. Scripture: Psalm 131
2. Subject: How should the people of God posture their hearts?
3. Complement: With humility by hoping and trusting in the Lord and not self importance
4. Main Idea: The people of God should posture their hearts with humility by hoping and trusting in the Lord and not self importance.

1. Scripture: Matthew 18:15-20
2. Subject: How should individuals in the church deal with the sins of a brother or sister?
3. Complement: Privately at first and slowly escalating it to the church publically if they still do not listen.
4. Main Idea: Individuals in the church should deal with sins of a brother or sister by bringing up the matter one-one, then with another or two, and then to the church publically, in progression, if they still do not listen.

1. Scripture: Esther
2. Subject: How did God protect the Jews from their enemies ?
3. Complement: By sovereignly placing people who worked for the good of their people and spoke up for the welfare of all Jews, which found favor in the eyes of God and men.

4. Main Idea: God protected the Jews by sovereignly placing people who worked for the good of their people and spoke up for the welfare of all Jews, which found favor in the eyes of God and men.

1. Scripture: Hebrews 13:5-6
2. Subject: How should people live?
3. Complement: With confidence that God is with us.
4. Main Idea: People should live with confidence because God is with us

1. Scripture: Daniel 4
2. Subject: How does God deal with people with great earthly authority?
3. Complement: He will give them a chance to respond to His Word, and if they repent, he will restore them and make them greater than they once were.
4. Main Idea: The King of all Kings will deal with those who have great earthly authority by giving them a chance to respond to His Word, and if they repent, he will restore them and make them greater than they once were.

1. Scripture: Luke 8:1-18
2. Subject: What does a person with a good heart look like?
3. Complement: They receive the word of God openly and are fruitful.
4. Main Idea: A person with a good heart receives the word of God, understands it, is fruitful in it, and is unafraid to share it.

1. Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 1:2-10
2. Subject: How does the church demonstrate faith?
3. Complement: Through power and conviction through the Holy Spirit, obedience to the teachings of Jesus, and being set apart from the world .
4. Main Idea: The church demonstrates faith through power and conviction through the Holy Spirit, obedience to the life of Jesus, and being set apart from the world (turning away from idols).

1. Scripture: Matthew 18:21-35
2. Subject: How should you deal with someone who sins against you?
3. Complement: Forgive them and release them from all debts and obligations toward you.
4. Main Idea: If someone sins against you, you should always forgive them and release them from all debts and obligations toward you.

1. Scripture: 1 Corinthians 8
2. Subject: How should you act around a person with a weaker conscience?
3. Complement: You should not do the thing that they once participated in before they knew Jesus
4. Main Idea: You should not do the things that a person with a weaker conscience used to participated in before they knew Jesus.
