What was the image of slavery before 1500?

What factors contributed to a new construction of slavery?

According to the textbook on page 537, it states that the factor that contributed to the reconstruction of slavery was, first the increase of slave trade, a significant percentage from North America to Portuguese Brazil and in the Caribbean. Secondly, due to the high rate in deaths in slaves which created a high rate in importing slaves for labor and lastly the separatism based on race and racial blending.

Why & how were American slave populations dehumanized?

Due to the high rate in population of slaves the royal government separated the slaves based on social order, and with brutality to have control.

They did not want the salves/workers to threaten the social economy power of elites so they constructed different image based not on economy but on race.
