Session 2: Citation Assignment
(10 Points)

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1. Create your NoodleTools account:

(on library webpage: www.nyack.edu/library)

- A. In the “Research Help” drop-down menu on the library website, choose “NoodleTools.”
- B. Click on “Register” to create your personal NoodleTools account.
- C. In the Subscription Type box/Nyack College Subscription Information, enter **nyackats** in the second box for School/Library Password. Click Continue.
- D. In About You, select “I am a student or library patron”, select expected year of graduation, choose a personal ID and password (use your Nyack.edu email and the last 4 digits of your SSN entered twice).
- E. Enter the last four digits of your phone number and your initials. Click “Register.”

***To register from **OFF CAMPUS** or if you prompted for a "revalidation login",
please use the following.***

- User Name: nyack
- Password: nyackats

Step 2. Create a new project in NoodleTools:

- A. Click on “New Project.” and enter a project title.
- B. Under Citation Style, choose “MLA” Advanced. Click Submit.
- C. Click on the hypertext project title on the left side of the screen.
- D. To add sources to your project, click on the “New Source” button at the top right of your screen..
- E. Under “Where is it?” choose the appropriate option.
- F. Under “What is it?” select the type of resource that describes what you wish to cite.
- G. Fill in all available pieces of information about the item you are citing.
- H. Use the contextual tips, and if you see a yellow **highlighted caution symbol**, that means you have a mistake to correct. Click into the box for helpful tips to correct your citation entry. If you see a **red underscore**, that means you have misspelled a word.
- I. When you have completed/corrected all parts of your citation, click “Save”. Pay attention to any messages to correct information.

Step 3. Cite the four resources on page 2 using NooleTools

Note: DO NOT ASSUME THAT THE TITLE IS CAPITALIZED CORRECTLY.
CLICK INTO THE BOX WHERE YOU ENTER THE TITLE FOR INSTRUCTIONS.

Step 4. Finish & Export to a Word Document and submit

- A. Once you have created all four citations click on the “Export/Print” icon in the top menu.
- B. Select Print/Export to Word or Google Docs. Export/Print “All sources”. Click “Submit”.
- C. Type in your name on top of the page.
- D. Submit your document in the Dropbox: Session 2: Citations Assignment by the due date.
